

# Bill McGinn Beats Blue Devils, 2-1, For Tar Heel Nine

## Star Lefty Allows Duke Only Three Hits To Win

Although he needed help from veteran George Whitted in a frantic ninth inning, Lefty Bill McGinn hurled Carolina to its third straight victory over Duke yesterday in Emerson Stadium as the Tar Heels staged off a desperate Blue Devil rally to win, 2-1.

McGinn continued his hex over the Dukes in a neat follow-up of last Monday's no-hitter against the same team as he held the visitors to two hits and no runs in the first eight innings.

But in the ninth the Tar Heel port-sider weakened and gave up his first run in his last 17 innings. McGinn was protecting a 2-0 Carolina lead but prosperity proved to be too much as he walked the first man up for Duke, Brandon Davis, on four pitches.

Tom Powers then laid down a bunt that McGinn fumbled for a Duke hit as the action put men on first and second with none away. After catcher Leroy Sires had fled to Joe Eldridge for the first putout, two wild pitches and another walk provided for Davis to score and McGinn's exit.

Whitted came into snuff out the rally by getting the next two batters on a pop up and a ground ball that Tar Heel short-stop Joe Brookshire converted into the final out.

McGinn was given an early lead in the opening stanza when the Tar Heels rocked Duke's hurler Bud Ayres for both runs. Bill Reeves led off with a line single and after Joe Eldridge walked, Charley Overman advanced both mates with a perfect sacrifice. Ed Lamb rammed a hit to left to score Reeves and then Eldridge tallied on Will Hobb's infield out.

## Lacrossemen End Season With VPI Win

Carolina's lacrosse team breezed to an easy victory yesterday morning by downing VPI's Gobblers, 11-2 on Navy Field. It was the stickmen's last game of the year and their fourth win against six losses.

The Tar Heels got off to a good start, scoring three goals in less than three minutes of the first quarter. Hal Taylor, Grant Lynch, and Art Greenbaum tallied for Carolina, and Johnny Murchison scored a few minutes later to give Carolina a 4-0 lead.

In the second quarter George Levine and Kirk Manning scored and the Tar Heels were in complete command for the rest of the game. The Gobbler's lone score in the first half came in the last 15 seconds when Luke Comegys fired it into the cage.

High scorer for Carolina was Grant Lynch who played crease-man instead of in his usual defense position. Lynch made two more in the third quarter from the crease. Taylor and Levine were tied for second scoring honors making two goals apiece.
