for a truce.

Gen. J. Lawton Collins, U.S. Army Chief of Staff, said on leaving for Washington after a tour of the Korean front that he "found the 8th Army in fine shape." But he declined to answer the question, "Are we in good enough shape to stay in Korea?"

Korean dispatches reported mounting indications that the long delayed advance of Chinese divisions south of Seoul might have begun.

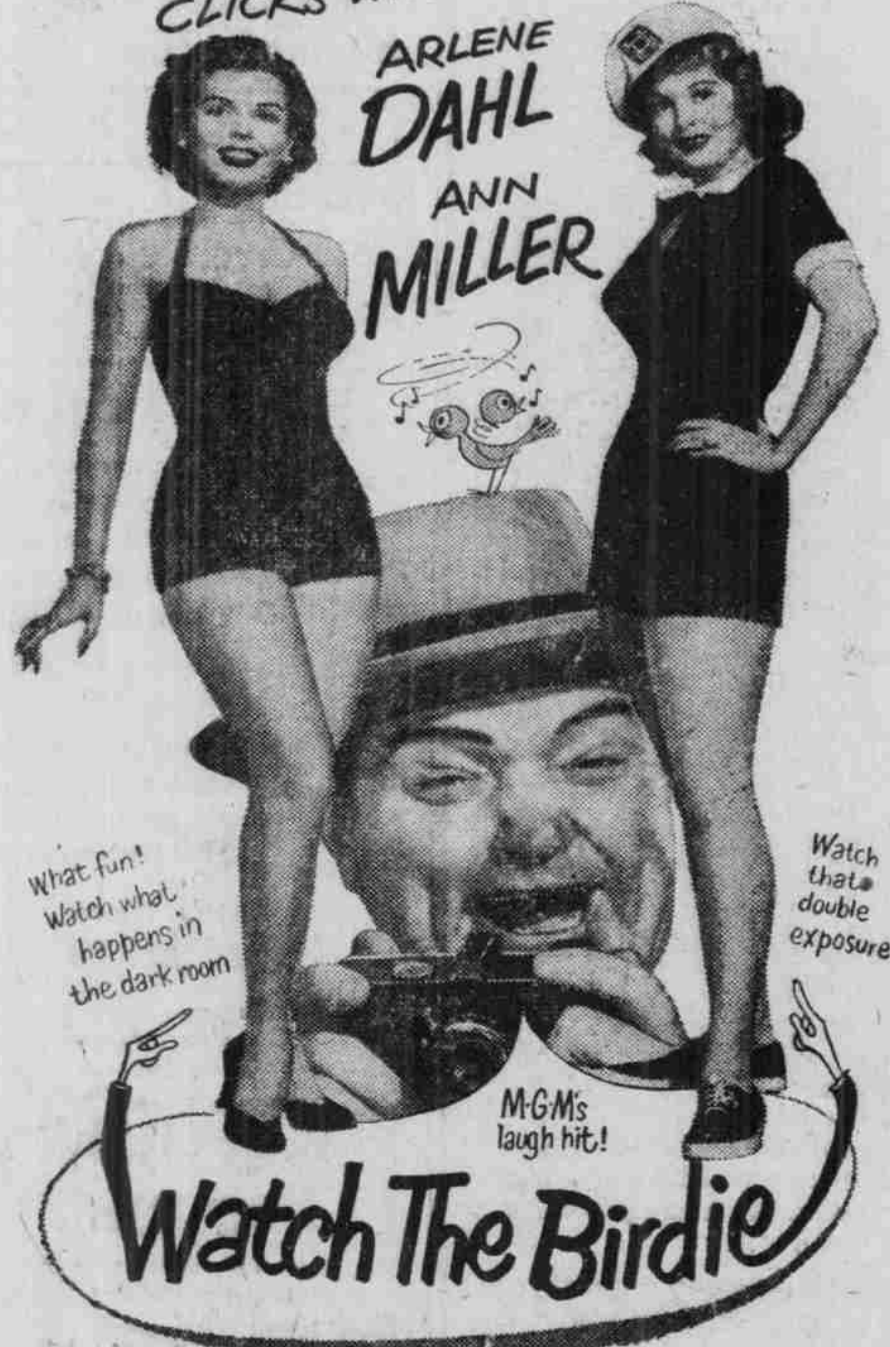
