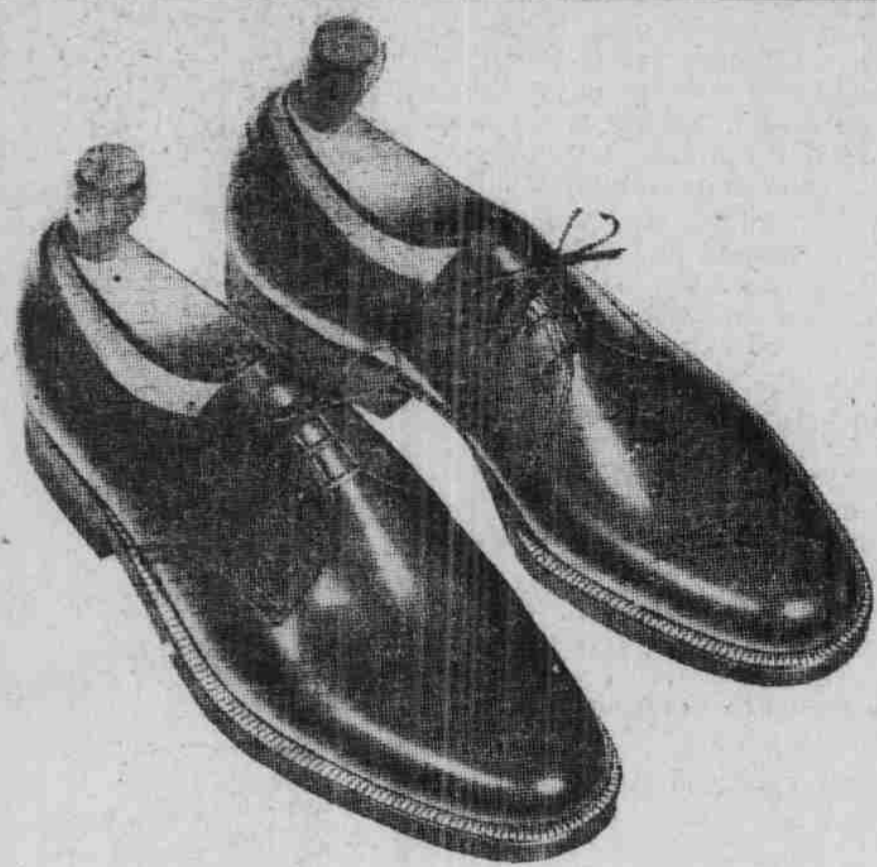

Four Coeds Pledged To Local SAI Group

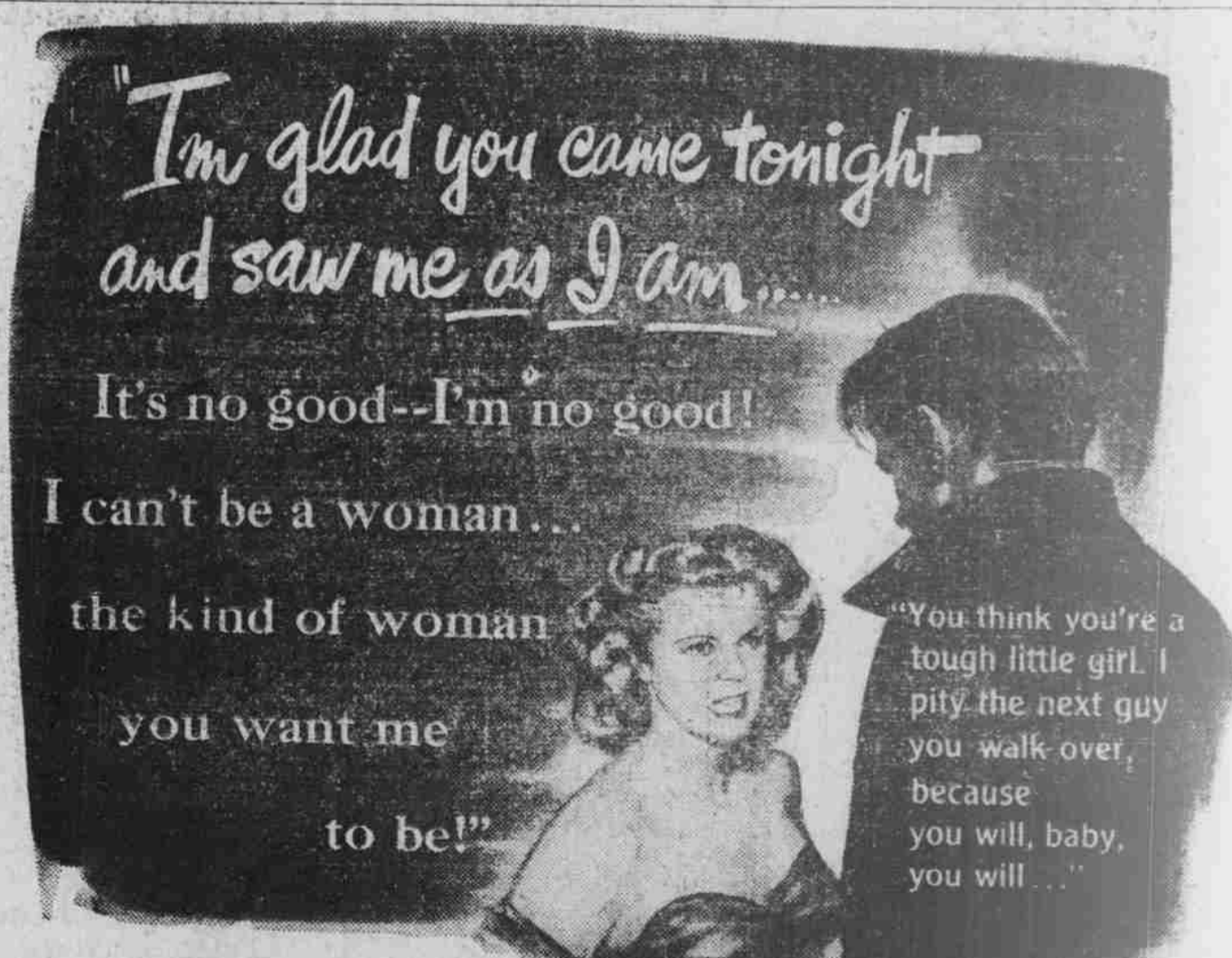
