

Tennis Team Hands Williams Second Straight Loss, 9-6

Tar Heels Meet W&M Here Today

"Gotta have it," yelled Bob Luxenberg to his doubles partner Bill Izlar as they approached the crucial point of their all-important match with Williams' Squires and Kent. And have it they did when the slender Tar Heel sent a tremendous overhead screaming past Dick Squires for the set, match, and the eighth and deciding point against a scrappy Williams College who battled down to the last shot yesterday afternoon before bowing to the Carolina netters, 9-6.

With the match score standing at 7-6 in favor of Carolina, the No. 2 doubles combination needed their win badly, it seemed, to make it a victorious afternoon and after three sets they came through, 6-1, 3-6, 6-4, but later on the doubles team of Johnny Booker and Charlie Lambeth added one for good measure when they reported in with a perfect 6-0, 6-0 win.

It was the seventh win for the Tar Heels who showed their superiority in doubles play by taking four of the five scheduled matches. Both teams won five of the ten singles with Dick Squires of Williams ousting Luxenberg in the top match, 6-2, 4-6, 6-3. Del Sylvia, Captain Heath Alexander, Bill Izlar, Shahan Haroutunian, and Johnny Booker all registered wins in singles play for Carolina.

Climaxing a full week of tennis, Coach Kenfield's slowly improving net squad will face powerful William and Mary here this afternoon at 3 o'clock on the varsity courts. The Indians, 5-4 losers to Davidson this week, will be out to avenge an 8-1 loss handed them by Carolina last year.

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Record Field In Carolina Relays Today; 300 Athletes From 14 Schools Compete

More than 300 athletes, representing the best in track from 14 Southern, Eastern, and Northern schools, will compete here tomorrow in the Sixth Annual Carolina Relays.

The field events will begin at 2:00 p.m. and the track events at 2:20 p.m.

Carolina, the reigning power in Southern Conference track, will be hard put in face of the competition from such powers as Princeton, Yale, Dartmouth, and Pennsylvania, plus Duke, Maryland, and Virginia from the South.

Other schools competing in the three-hour relay carnival are: Georgetown, Davidson, Virginia Tech, N. C. State, Sewanee, and NYU.

The meet is composed of 13 varsity and three freshmen events, all of the track events but three being of the relay variety.

Carolina will get another crack at some of the Princeton men who

snapped their string of 12 straight dual meet victories last Monday. It will also be an advance picture of the Duke team that is being called the Blue Devils' best since the war.

Among the records likely to go will be the pole vault where George Appel of Yale will be shooting at the mark of 13 feet, 3-4 inches set last year by Martin Korik of Tennessee.

Well-Balanced Golfers Seek Seventh Straight Win Today

Carolina's well-balanced golf team, which has already stroked its way to six straight dual meet victories and a first place in the first annual Intercollegiate North-South tourney, will get a chance to make it win number seven this afternoon when Williams College is here for a 1:30 meet at the Finley course.

In today's meet Coach Erickson will probably string along with his usual top six men—McKnight, Williamson, Brooks, Brown, Bob Black, and Frank Eckert. This has been his most effective combination, although both Jimmy Ferree and R. L. MacDonald have been pushing for a place in the select six.

McKnight and Black will play together as usual with Williamson and Brooks, and Brown and Eckert also playing their same twosomes.

The victory in the Intercollegiate North-South tourney on Tuesday is indicative of the team's standing in Southern Conference circles. Also playing in the meet was last year's SC team winner, Wake Forest, but this time the Deacons were in second place—three strokes behind the Tar Heels.

Black was the low man at the Pinehurst meet with a four-over-par 76. Following him were Brown with 77, Brooks with 78, and Williamson with a 78. These

Carolina Nine Meets State Tomorrow

The Tar Heel baseballers, sporting a 6-3 record, meet N. C. State tomorrow at Emerson Stadium for their Big Four opener. Henry Schacht, who turned in good performances against Boston and Rollins before he was injured will probably be the starting pitcher for Carolina. However, Co-captain Bill McGinn may start on the mound.

While the varsity plays here, the UNC frosh will travel to Raleigh to meet the State freshmen at Devereaux Meadow. It will be the opening game for the Tar Babies.

Schacht, a southpaw from Davidson, holds one victory over Boston University. He pitched a neat three-hitter in that outing. McGinn, another left-hander, has a 1-1 record this year with a win over Michigan State and a loss to Virginia. Both Schacht and McGinn have allowed three earned runs each—Schacht in 11 1/2 innings and McGinn in 13.

Other probable starters include Catcher Dick Weiss, who nearly pulled the Tar Heels out of the hole in the last Yale Game just before it was rained out with a homer to right center field which scored the only two runs for Carolina.

Starting at first base will be either Ben Smith or Bob Henning, with Mark Herring at second. Herring is among the top Tar Heel hitters with a .272 mark. Smith also ranks high with his .223.

Pacing the Tar Heel hitting will probably be outfielder Bill Reeves, who is batting .382 to date and leads the team in runs.

Reeves was the only scores which figured in team scoring.

Ferree also played in the meet however and came in with a 77.

Wesley Brown of Washington and Lee, and brother of Carolina's Lou Brown, was the medalist with a 73.

Ex-Tar Heel Vinnie DiLorenzo Gets Relief Victory Over Sox

Vinnie DiLorenzo, southpaw ace of the 1948 Carolina baseball team that went to the finals in the Eastern NCAA playoffs, turned in a brilliant relief performance against the hard-hitting Boston Red Sox Wednesday afternoon in Jacksonville, Fla.

DiLorenzo, pitching for the Jacksonville Tars of the Class A Sally League, relieved Starting Pitcher Graves in the seventh inning of yesterday's slugfest after the Sox had landed on him for four runs.

The former Tar Heel cooled the Boston bats with ease to nip the surge and shut out the big leaguers in the last two frames as his mates rallied to win, 3-7.

DiLorenzo is a New York Giant farmhand and has pitched for Sioux City, Iowa, in the Class A Central League, Jersey City in the Triple A International League, and Jacksonville since joining the pros in 1948.

He will be remembered in batted in with eight. He has connected safely 13 times in 34 trips.

The remainder of the starting lineup will probably have Joe Brookshire at shortstop, John (Sleepy) Senter at third, with Wayne White, Tom Stevens and Reeves in the outfield.

Southern Conference baseball circles for his brilliant no-hitter pitched during the 1947 season. Carolina's Bill McGinn last year tossed the first Big Four no-hitter since DiLorenzo's masterpiece.

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
