

# Tar Baby Track Team Takes Opening Meet With Ease

## UNC Sweeps Six Events, Wins, 84-38

The Carolina freshman track team opened its dual meet season successfully by blasting High Point High School, 84-38, here yesterday, taking all but three first places and sweeping five events.

The Tar Babies won all three places in the 120-yard high hurdles, javelin, 440, pole vault, and 880. Two of the High firsts were by Bobby Potts in the shot put and discus, and in both cases he was using the high school version of the weight while the Tar Babies were throwing the college model.

Carolina showed depth in its rout, with only Billy Duke winning more than one first: Duke taking the pole vault and broad jump. Duke won the pole vault with the very good vault of 12 feet, with Tar Babies Fred Mewhinney and Bob Hood taking second and third.

Duke won the broad jump with a leap of 19 feet, 10 3/4 inches, topping Martin Cecil of High Point and Mewhinney of Carolina.

Tony Houghton, who entered Carolina just this quarter, won the mile handily in the good time of 4:43.5 without extending himself. He whipped Art Newman of High Point by 20 yards with Russ Glatz of Carolina just a step behind Newman.

Charlie Scott of Carolina led teammates Sonny Beall and Eddie Haire to victory in the high hurdles. Scott finished three strides ahead of Beall and ran in the creditable time of 15.6.

Deacons were definitely "off" against Carolina, the Tar Heel performance was, nevertheless, very convincing.

The win boosted Carolina into a second place tie with Wake Forest in the Big Four standings. Each team now has a 500 record.

A win over the Wildcats today would boost Tar Heel stock considerably in the Southern Conference race, leaving Carolina with a 2-1 loop record and boosting them into second place in the Southern division.

Tar Heel Coaches Bunn Hearn and Walt Rabb received a good bit of encouragement from Catcher Dick Wiess and Third Baseman Sleepy Senter in the Wake Forest game. Both boys collected three hits for the day, and promise to add a great deal to the Tar Heel offense. Wiess' three hits moved him well above the 300 mark after an early-season slump. The husky catcher is now hitting .323, second only to Billy Reeves and Bobby Henning among the regulars.

## Henning Top UNC Hitter With .438

First Baseman Bobby Henning, a reserve at the first of the season, has catapulted into the lead among Carolina hitters. Henning, a blond flash from Winston-Salem, collected four hits in seven trips to the plate in the Tar Heels' last two games to boost his average to .438.

Centerfielder Billy Reeves, last week's leader, hit a slump this week and dropped from .387 to .326 but is still second to Henning. Pitcher Bill McGinn is the non-nominal leader with a hefty .455 mark but he has been at bat only 11 times.

Catcher Dick Wiess was the big hitting star of the past week, duplicating Henning's four for seven mark to pass the .300 mark for the first time since early in the season. He is now hitting .323 and has eight runs-batted-in to his credit. Reeves leads in that department with 9 RBIs.

Third Baseman Sleepy Senter leads the team in runs scored with 11, while Reeves has the most hits, 14. Wiess is the leading slugger with three doubles, two triples, one home run, and four singles.

Al Wood, Henry Schacht, and Joe Pazdan all have perfect pitching records with one win and no losses, but Chalmers Port and Bill McGinn are the top hurlers with two wins and one loss each.

Port is the leading strikeout artist with 16 whiffs to his credit. He is also the stingiest base-on-balls hurler, having given up only one Annie Oakley in 19 1-3 innings.

McGinn is second in strikeouts with 14 and leads in innings pitched with 22.

## Golfers Face Stern Test In Michigan Here Today

An eight-meet winning streak will face its sternest test tomorrow afternoon at 1:30 when Carolina's golf team runs into highly-touted Michigan on the University's Finley golf course.

The well-balanced Tar Heel team has run up eight comparatively easy victories without a defeat but the Wolverines are given a great chance of handing out the first loss.

Carolina defeated the Michigan team last year at Hope Valley, 18-9, and Michigan has four members of that six-man team back again this year.

They are led by number one player, Bob Olsen, who shot a one-under par 71 while losing to Harvie Ward's 68 last year. Following Olsen in the number two spot is former National Junior champ (1948), Dean Lind, another veteran.

The Wolverines have two other outstanding returnees in Dick Evans, son of one of the nation's former top amateurs, Chick Evans, and Roland LeClair.

Coach Chuck Erickson will play his usual team with the exception of Jimmy Ferree shot the low medal, a 71, on Monday against Virginia. He will team with Bill Williamson in one Carolina twosome.

In the other Tar Heel twosomes will be Frank Brooks and Lew Brown, and Bob Black and Rodney McKnight.

If the Michigan team wants to play a seven-man match, as Carolina did against Virginia, then Frank Eckert will play the final spot for the Tar Heels.

The Carolina team will have to depend on its strength down the line, Coach Erickson felt yesterday, to beat the Wolverines. Brooks, Black, McKnight, Williamson, Brown, and Ferree all have been medalists in the previous meets of the year.
