

# Carolina Tennis Team Blanks Wolfpack, 8-0

## Will Meet Duke Here Tomorrow

Father met son on the varsity courts yesterday afternoon and once again experience prevailed over youthful determination. Coach John Kenfield's Carolina netters were too much for Coach Jack Kenfield's N. C. State tennis team, whipping the lads from Raleigh 8-0 in a long match hampered by frequent rains.

Although the team score indicates a decisive triumph for the locals, individual play was close in several matches and the out-classed visitors took four sets from the Tar Heels.

Del Sylvia, Heath Alexander, and Bill Izlar all dropped a set to their opponents in singles play before coming through. The number one doubles team of Sylvia and Alexander failed to finish their match with State's Ragan and Skeen when darkness prevented their finishing a 5-5 third set.

Overall it was a sluggish afternoon for the Tar Heels, with only one player scoring a clear-cut decisive victory. No. 6 man Paul Keenan blasted State's Bob Croxson between showers in straight sets, 6-2, 6-1.

No. 1 man Del Sylvia, slowed down considerably by the weather, finally subdued the Wolfpack's ace, Caldwell Ragan after three sets, 10-8, 3-6, 6-2.

In doubles play the "jinxed" No. 3 spot finally produced a winner when Buck Buchanan and Charles Lambeth edged out State's Croxson and Jones, 7-5, 7-5.

### Play Duke

Wednesday the Carolina netters will face their toughest opponent of the year when Duke comes to Chapel Hill for an important Southern Conference match. The Blue Devils kept their conference record perfect Saturday when they ran over Davidson, 6-3. This coming Saturday the Tar Heels will meet Davidson here.

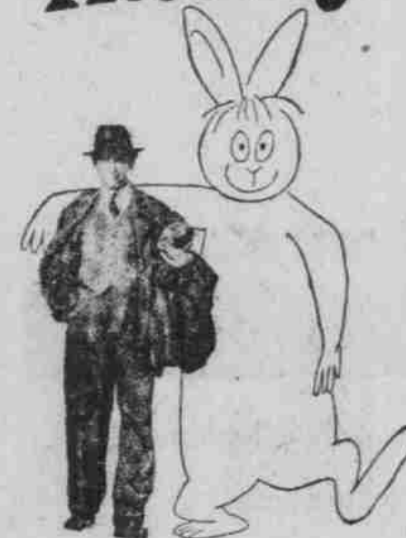

## Carolina Wins Four Of Five On Weekend

State nosed out the Carolina baseball team, 12-1, but the golfers, track team, tennis team, and freshman baseball team won athletic contests held Friday and Saturday.

The Wolfpack jumped to a 12-5 lead in the fifth inning and held on despite four runs in the sixth and two in the seventh by Carolina, leaving the Tar Heels only one run behind.

Bill Lore was the only effective Carolina hurler, holding the Wolfpack scoreless and giving up only two hits in three innings. The hitting stars for Carolina were Mark Herring, who got four for five, Bill Reeves, who got three hits, including a homer, and Dick Weiss, with three hits.

The Carolina golf team remained undefeated by beating Georgetown, 26½ to 3½, averaging one over par. Bob Black shot a one under par 71. Frank Eckert was even at 72, Rodney McKnight was one over, while Bob Brooks, and Lou Brown ended with two and three over par, respectively.

The tennis team romped over ETC, 9-0, in one of the easiest wins of the year. The track team also had an easy time, whipping Camp Lejeune, 84-47, at the Marines' base.

Carolina took 11 firsts in the track meet. They were by Frank Scott in the broad jump and low hurdles, Gordon Hamrick, Gene Brigham in the 440, Dave Willis in the 100, Garrett Fitzgibbons in the high hurdles, Jack Bennett in the 880, Phil Burkhalter in the two mile, Billy Joyner in the high jump, Bob House in the pole vault, and the mile relay team of Mack Ray, Scooter McLain, Jim Hamrick, and Gene Brigham.

## Triple Play In 9th Helps Wildcats Win, 8-7

The winning tally came after Davidson had killed a North Carolina threat in the top of the ninth with a triple play.

Wayne White led off for North Carolina in the ninth with a triple, Tom Stevens followed with a walk and then Joe Brookshire

hit a line drive to Bill Roland in centerfield. Roland threw for the plate, but Whisnant cutoff the throw, threw to second and caught Stevens sliding in. White, who had broken for home, cut back for third, but was caught by the throw from second, completing the triple play.

Davidson's winning run came in the ninth with two out. Whisnant singled bringing in Jack Branch.
