for his convictions and "gave him my vote for president." Most students agreed he delivered an "inspired, great speech," but maintained that MacArthur was wrong and that "President Truman was justified in his actions," as Jack Hopkins put it. "The General's statements will hurt our foreign policy," Hopkins asserted.

In the television room of Graham Memorial, as in restaurants and fraternity houses equipped with TV, groups of students huddled about the video screen and added running ad libs to the General's speech. There was considerable comment after MacArthur pointed out that the joint chiefs of staff had supported him in his Asiatic policies. But Dick Murphy exclaimed MacArthur's speech was indicative of "intellectual bankruptcy."

The air began charging with dramatic - although moist because of rainy weather - tension as the time for Gen. Omar Bradley's address. Hopes that the chairman of the joint chiefs of staff would deliver a policy-level statement were widespread. And at 6:45, lines were already beginning to form outside Memorial Hall for the 8:30 appearance by Bradley.

munism spreading there is greatly reduced. "They will fight for us, particularly if they think they have a chance to win," asserted the speaker.

"Can the General justify the recent draft cutback," a Carolina male wanted to know. He emphasized that it was out of his department and that the knowledge "comes secondhand from General Collins (J. Lawton Collins, Army Chief of Staff)." More than 60 percent of the men being discharged are reenlisting, more men are enlisting, and Korean casualties are down, were reasons given for the recent curtailment in draft calls.

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
