The Vols, who meet Carolina tomorrow at 10 a.m., will be favored to win, but Holmberg wouldn't have you believe he contributes much to their success. He described himself in a letter to this writer as "UT's import from Sweden; a miler who is no good in cross-country." Quite the contrary, Holmberg, a junior at Tennessee, is considered by track coaches as one of the most promising young trackmen in the world. Last year Holmberg placed first in the famous Sugar Bowl mile.

Besides Holmberg, the Vols have two other outstanding harriers in Frank Albertson, who won the mile run in the inter-conference track meet last spring, and John Trent, holder of the twomile crown in the same meet. Other capable Vols are Al Kuykendall, an impressive junior; Charles Wiats, whom Holmberg describes as "a typical crosscountry runner;" Dick Gamble, "a freshman who has been looking very good in practice;" Rob Reeder, "half miler who is best on a flat course;" and Dick Kilwell, "a junior quarter miler who takes cross-country more as practice than actual competition."




