

Holy Cross Is First Carolina Foe In Classic

Carolina Swimmers To Meet Bainbridge On January 10

Carolina's Southern Conference swimming champs will put their perfect record on the line when they meet the powerful Bainbridge Naval Training Station on January 10, 1953.

The Tar Heel swimmers have had two meets thus far this season — defeating both Virginia Military Institute and Duke. Members of the squad will cut short their Christmas holidays and return to Chapel Hill on Dec. 29 to begin preparations for the Bainbridge meet.

In winning their tenth consecutive conference title last year, Carolina went through its second straight undefeated season with a perfect 12-0 record. In the last 14 seasons, the Tar Heel club has compiled a record of 102 wins and only 12 defeats.

Included in the string of wins last season was a 54-30 decision over the Bainbridge club. The Naval swimmers consistently put out a competitive squad, and are expected to put up another stiff battle for Carolina.

Thus far this season, Co-captain Donnie Evans and Buddy Baerce have led Coach Ralph Casey's Tar Heels. Other leaders have been Barry Wall, Joe Kelso, Jack Edwards, and Buddy Heins.

Coach Casey is in his first season as head coach for the Carolina squad. He succeeded veteran coach Dick Jamerson when the latter resigned last summer.

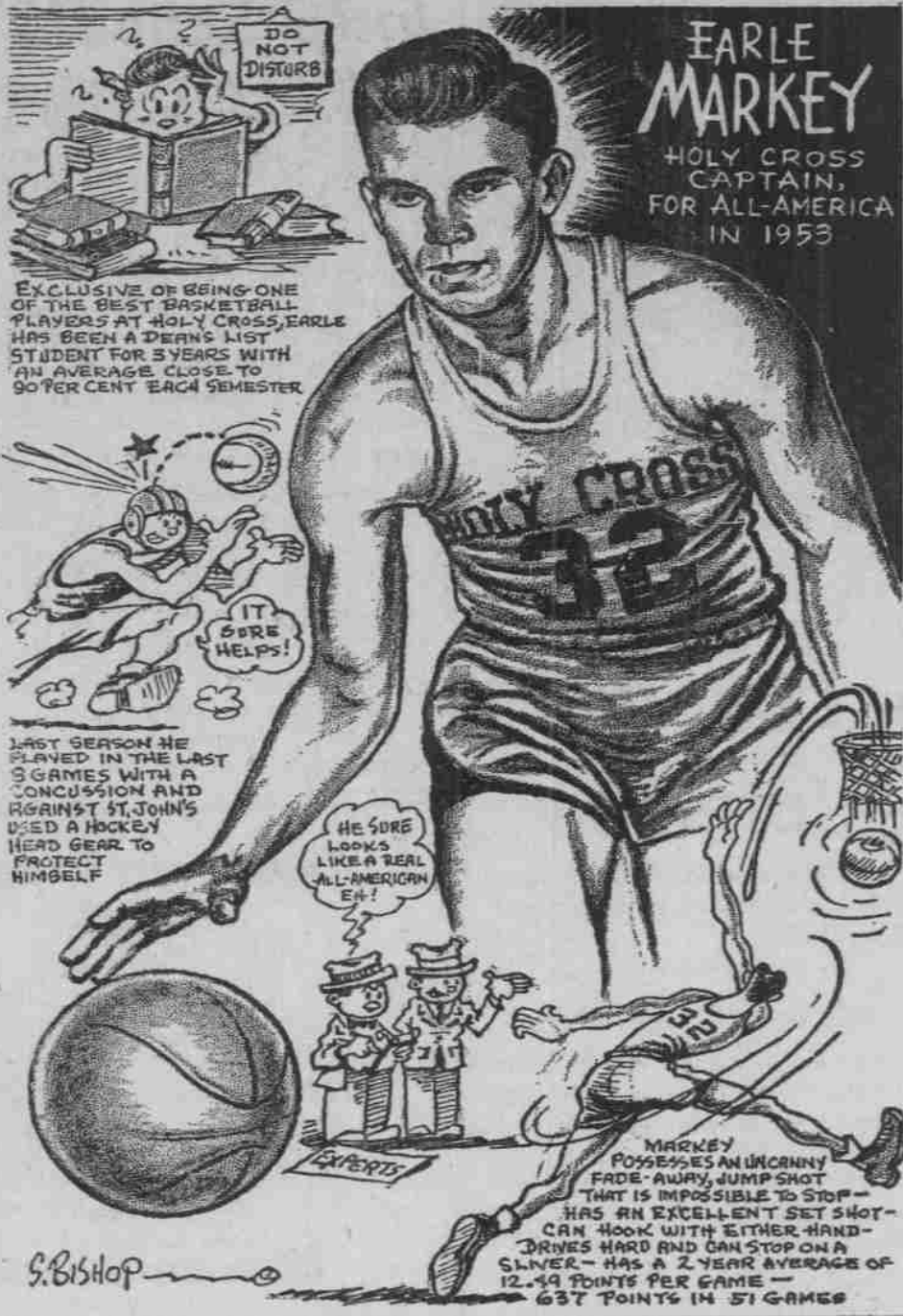
Edwards was one of the outstanding performers in the 47-37 victory over V. M. I. for the Blue Dolphins. He broke the old V.M.I. pool record in the 100-yard freestyle, chipping off two tenths of a second as he edged past Evans.

The Bainbridge meet will be held in the Naval team's home pool. The Tar Heels will make their first appearance in Chapel Hill on Jan. 16, when they meet Georgia Tech. Other games with Virginia Tech, Davidson, Florida, Emory, Georgia, and Virginia remain on the schedule.

Tar Heels To Be Idle Until Raleigh Tourney Dec. 29-31

The Carolina basketball team, winner of its first four starts in the Southern Conference, will remain idle until December 29 when it plays its first non-Conference rival, Holy Cross, in the first round of the Dixie Classic.

The Crusaders have been the number one team in New England for the past five years, and although they lost four starters through graduation, they are still rated tops in their district. Holy Cross will play three games during the holidays, and the experts will wait for the outcome before declaring odds on the Classic battle in Raleigh. On the strength of Carolina's four wins and the Crusaders one start, the game is rated a tossup.

Show Speed
The Tar Heels have shown speed and the ability to score under the direction of Frank McGuire in his first year as the Carolina pilot. Carolina finished its pre-Christmas season Wednesday night by defeating Clemson, 82-56, for its best scoring effort of the season. Carolina has averaged better than 70 points per game this season, taking The Citadel, 70-50, Washington and Lee, 67-48, and University of Richmond, 80-64, in its other three starts.

Sparkling the Tar Heels this season is six-foot, three-inch freshman forward Jerry Vayda. Vayda has been high scorer in two of Carolina's games, and leads the team in the scoring department with a total of 75 points. Co-captain and guard Vince Grimaldi follows Vayda with 65 points, and scored 26 against Clemson for the highest individual effort of the year.

All-America Candidate
Most of Holy Cross' hopes rest on its All-America candidate, captain Earle Markey, a six-foot, one-inch guard that made honorable mention on every All-America squad last year. Markey is the Holy Cross high scorer, and was All-Catholic, All-American last year.

The Crusaders had an excellent 24-4 record last year, and coach Lester "Gus" Sheary will be out to make a good showing the school's first try in the Dixie Classic. Holy Cross has never played Carolina, but has a 1-2 record against N. C. State in tournament games.
