

The Carolina basketball team, winner of its first four starts in the Southern Conference, will remain idle until December 29 when it plays its first non-Conference rival, Holy Cross, in the first round of the Dixie Classic.

Carolina has averaged better than 70 points per game this season, taking The Citadel, 70-50, Washington and Lee, 67-48, and University of Richmond, 80-64, in its other three starts.

Sparking the Tar Heels this season is six-foot, three-inch freshman forward Jerry Vayda. Vayda has been high scorer in two of Carolina's games, and leads the team in the scoring department with a total of 75 points. Co-captain and guard Vince Grimaldi follows Vayda with 65 Clemson for the highest individual effort of the year.
