

In his address Dr. Doak discussed research progress within the Venereal Disease Experimental Laboratory in Chapel Hill, of

which he is assistant director. Dr. Doak explained that since 1943, when penicillin replaced arsenic drugs in the treatment of syphilis, scientists have been developing drugs which are compounds of phosphorus and testing them against organisms which cause syphilis and other diseases.

"Many of these drugs show promising therapeutic properties," Dr. Doak reported, "but at this ime we cannot say that they will be of any value."

Dr. Doak explained that the reearch with organophosphorus ompounds has a double object: 1) finding the life cycle of the rganism which cause syphilis by inding which drugs are effective m destroying it; and (2) finding lrugs other than penicillin which might be non-toxic and might be used in cases where penicillin cannot be used, such as patients with sensitivity to penicillin.

Dr. Doak, who joined the UNC faculty in 1978, is a native of Canada and took his doctorate in pharmaceutical chemistry at the University of Wisconsin. For 10 years before he came to Chapel Hill he was a research asociate
