

# The Ivy Stands Aside And Holly Has Its Day

At Yuletide it is appropriate to point out that holly has temporarily eclipsed the ivy at UNC. It was planned that way.  
The seven miles of "Holly Trail" in Chapel Hill represents a unique gardening accomplishment on this beautiful campus.  
The ten years of careful attention to developing the wintertime potential of green plants that thrive in cold weather—especially holly—is now paying off.  
The holly, all over North Carolina, is bigger, brighter, crisper than at any time in the memory of gardeners. This is especially true at Chapel Hill where the landscaping experts who are in charge of keeping the campus beautiful display a quiet pride of accomplishment.  
Now that the ivy has lost its leaves the holly is taking its place,

and the red berries are clustered, big and ripe.  
The wet weather coincided this past Fall with the pollenization time for the holly. This is holly's year.  
The man in the forefront of the decade of holly planting here is Francis J. LeClair, who came to Chapel Hill after retirement as a horticulturalist and has worked as a landscape artist for the University. LeClair continues as a landscaping consultant.  
The main idea behind the evergreen planting, including holly, is to keep the campus fresh and attractive the year-around, and not just in the spring and summer.  
Visitors may see holly spotted here and there in bushes, hedges and trees. LeClair has planted them beside walkways, to enhance the beauty of buildings, old and new. In some places holly has been planted to hide places that are not so attractive—such as the luxuriant growth of holly near Caldwell Hall, to make the outside fire escape stairs less conspicuous.  
The holly here is in many varieties, chiefly as foundation plantings, as individual specimens and in barriers, screens and hedges.

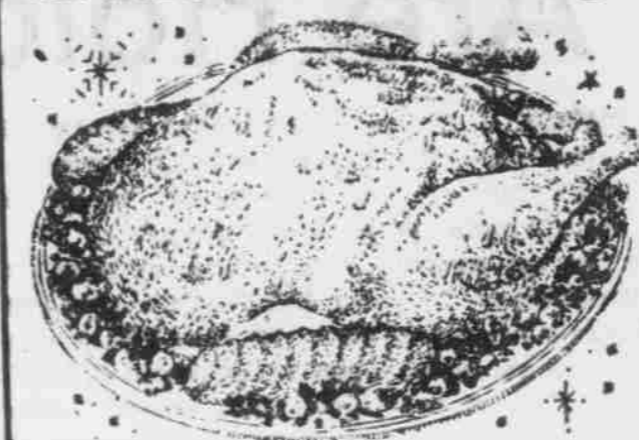

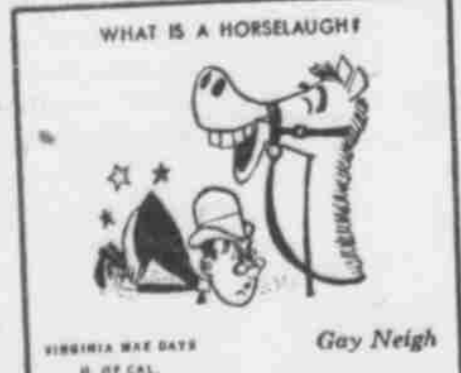
