HISTORICAL SOCIETY ELECTS

D. L. Corbett of the State Department of Archives and History in Raleigh has been elected president of the North Carolina Historical Society, which held its fall meeting this weekend on the UNC campus. He succeeds Dr. Hugh T. Lefler of the UNC history faculty. Ending his year's term as president, Dr. Lefler addressed the society Friday night.

Other new officers are Cecil Johnson of UNC, vice president, and M. L. Skaggs of Greensboro College, secretary-treasurer.

Dr. Johnson is professor of history and dean of the General College at UNC. Dr. Lefler is Kenan professor of history here.

Other historians who addressed the gathering were Dr. Blackwell Robinson of High Point College, who

spoke about the late Aubrey Lee Brooks, Greensboro attorney, and David Stick of Dare County, who discussed the inlets of the Outer Banks, an area about which he has written several books.

MED SCHOOL FACULTY

The speakers will be Dr. Eugene W. Loesser, division of neurology, and Dr. Margaret C. Leventon of the department of biology, both faculty members of the School of Medicine.

PROBLEMS FACING POETS DESCRIBED

The hard problems which modern poets face in reaching a responsive audience were described by a UNC associate professor of English in recent talks here to students at

Mitchell College.

Dr. Lyman Cotten participated in the college's symposium on the arts, speaking on "The Modern Poet and his Audience." In addition to his discussion of difficulties encountered by poets of the last 150 years, he led informal sessions with smaller groups of Mitchell College students.

He did undergraduate work at Chapel Hill and received his Ph. D. degree from Yale University.
