He noted that 1,575 persons died on North Carolina highways in 1964, an increase of 194 over the previous year.

"An automobile inspection law could bring about an immediate 10 per cent reduction in this terrible toll," he said. "If such a law had eisxted last year, 157 citizens of our state would be alive today."

The \$300 million road bond issue, Moore said, "would be financed within the present tax structure utilizing the one cent per gallon tax which has financed the secondary road bond issue of 1949." It would be vot-


