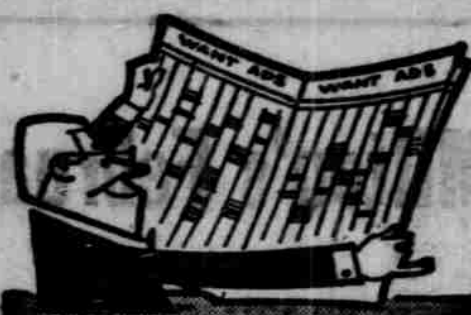

Moore's advocacy of the two year, 10 per cent teacher pay hike went against the recommendations of the Advisory Budget Commission, which had recommended only a \$15-a-month increase for next year.

The governor slowed his pace and measured every word as he referred to the 1964 Civil Rights Act, under which discrimination must be eliminated completely from schools receiving federal assistance.

"There are now new laws and regulations which will change the way many of our schools are operated," he said. "As much as we dislike these changes, I remind you of our state's proud heritage as a peaceful and law-abiding people."

chamber ring with the words "the law must be obeyed."

Moore's voice took on a somber, almost ominous note as he turned to his proposal for an automobile inspection program. He noted that 1,575 persons died on North Carolina highways in 1964, an increase of 194 over the previous year.

"An automobile inspection law could bring about an immediate 10 per cent reduction in this terrible toll," he said. "If such a law had existed last year, 157 citizens of our state would be alive today."

The \$300 million road bond issue, Moore said, "would be financed within the present tax structure utilizing the one cent per gallon tax which has financed the secondary road bond issue of 1949." It would be voted on by the public.

He recommended \$150 million of the bonds issue be spent on primary roads, \$75 million for highways within municipalities and \$75 million for secondary roads.

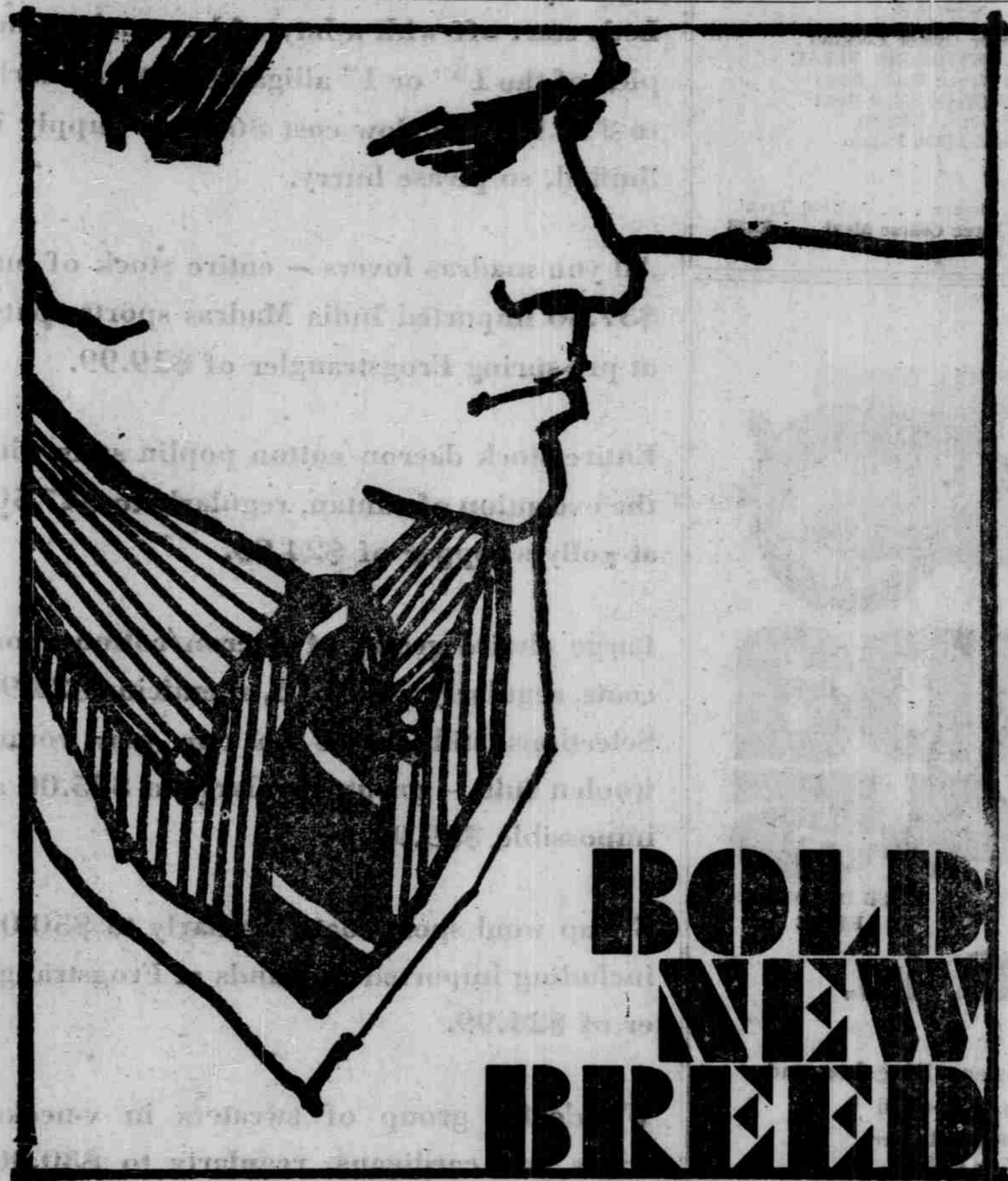

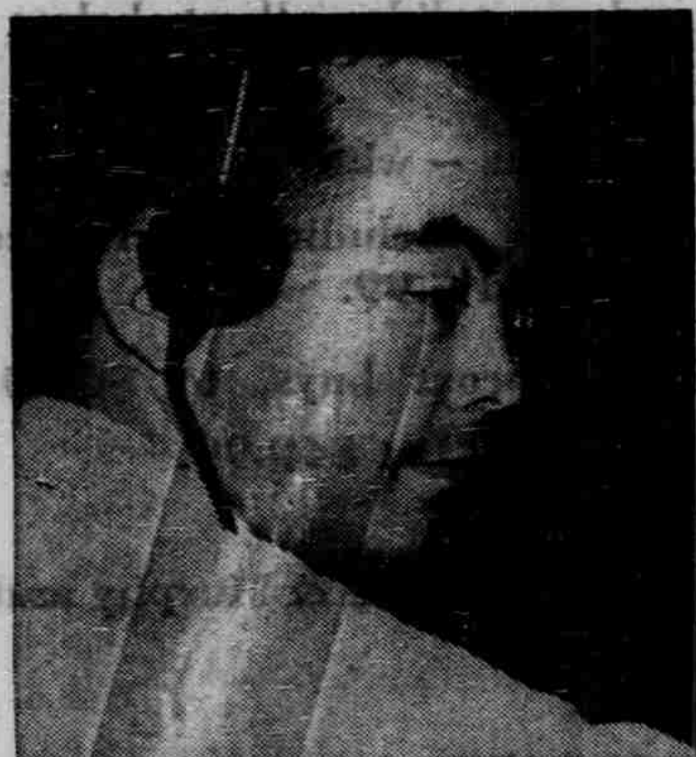
