

# Forum Gets First In Meet At Yale

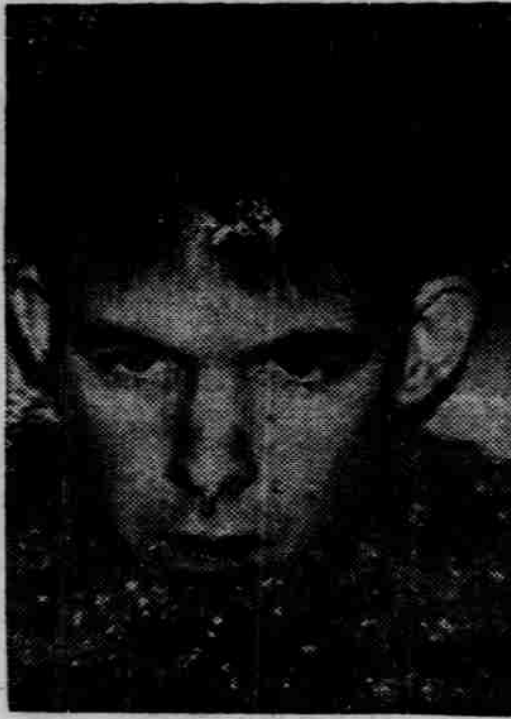
NEW HAVEN (AP) — Rick Forum became the first North Carolina swimmer to take a first in the 1965 Eastern Seaboard College Swimming Championships by capturing the 200-yard breaststroke with a time of 2:18.4 Friday.

The Tar Heels were in third place going into yesterday's action, with a total of 102 points. Harrison Merrill and Fred Lipp both took third places. Merrill did it in the 200-yard freestyle while Lipp placed in the 200-yard butterfly.

Jack Hayden took an eighth in the 200-yard backstroke and Steve Hildenbrand was 11th in the 200 individual medley.

Highlighting Friday's action was Yale's Ed Townsend's breaking of the 200-yard individual medley record with a time of 2:02.1. He broke the old mark of 2:03.8 by Harvard's Bob Kaufman in 1961, which was the oldest standing Eastern Seaboard record.

Another Eli, Olympian Steve Clark, successfully defended his 200-yard freestyle title in 1:45.1 to match it with the 50-

yard sprint crown he captured Thursday night.

The final events of the three-day meet were finished yesterday, but because of the press time the results will appear in Tuesday's Tar Heel along with a full recap of the meet.

# ACC Eastern Tourney Bye Reassured By Providence

The Atlantic Coast Conference's bye in the opening round of the Eastern Regional NCAA basketball tournament was reassured Friday when Providence defeated St. Josephs.

The ACC representative does not have to go to the opening round of the tourney in Philadelphia to win a berth as do the other representatives.

Going into this weekend, the ACC had a record of 30 - 18 (.613) in NCAA competition, while the Middle Atlantic Conference was 19 - 14 (.576).

However, if NC State had lost both games, the percentage would be .600, which St. Josephs could have topped for the MAC by getting to the NCAA finals.

However, despite State's disappointing showing, the Friars of Providence came through for the second time this season to knock off the Hawks 81-73.

The record was built up by teams such as the National Champion Tar Heels of 1957, the Wake Forest teams of 1961-1962 and the Duke teams of 1963 and '64.

# Carolina Hurt In Conference By No Wrestling Scholarships

The disappointing showing of this year's wrestling team can somewhat be attributed to the fact that UNC does not grant wrestling scholarships, according to Coach Sam Barnes.

Six of Maryland's ACC Championship grapplers are paid for their mat work, and most other conference schools give scholarships. But Carolina begins practice each year with fingers crossed, and the result is that Tar Heels wrestling fluctuates from good to bad and we have yet to get our backs off the mat yet against the Terps.

This year was one of the bad ones. "It has been a strange season," Barnes remarked. "We were very unbalanced with some strong weight divisions and many weak ones. The other teams geared their strategy accordingly and just hit at it. It is hard to go out knowing we will be giving away 14 points a match. The boys work hard, but we were short on confidence."

Just how unbalanced the Tar Heels were this season is shown by examining the 147 and 157-pound divisions. Roy Hagerty, Bill Cook and Lane Verlenden are three of the best on the squad, but all were restricted to the 147 division, and naturally only one could wrestle.

The same is true of the 157-pounders, Elliott Dworin, who finished second in the conference, won the starting berth over Jay Jacobson and Jay Han-

an, both excellent wrestlers. The result was that the two Jays had to go into higher weight classes.

Despite the loss of four seniors — Russ Simmons, Ken Furr, Dave Wiles and Elliott Dworin — the outlook is bright for next year.

"We had an unusually good group of sophomores," said Barnes. "We also have some good freshmen who can move up to fill some gaps, such as Dave


Kiel (123), John Stacy (137) and Fred Priester (177)."

Returning will be Hagerty, Al Franusziszin (123), Jacobson, Bill Johnson (hw), Steve Lister (hw), Chuck Alexander (hw), Cook, Jim Goodwin (130), Verlenden and Jack Saunders (123). Also returning after a year's layoff will be Wes Robinson (177).

Maryland and Virginia, the conference's two top teams this year, each lose five starters. "We think we will be a better team next year," reasoned Barnes. "If we don't have some unforeseen disappointments, we should have a successful season."
