

Grants were made by the Field Foundation in Atlanta for work with student legal rights and by the National Institute of Mental Health for studies on student stress and drug use.


Choir will appear at Chapel Hill High School for the Martin Luther King Memorial Assembly. The Singeleiter Choir is so-named because all of its members are conductors
