



"Mr. Boshamer is devotes his business attention one of the most loyal friends of the University," the Chancellor said. "His generosity extends to all areas of the University. Rabb said that Mr. Boshamer's gifts of the stadium and lighting will provide Carolina with baseball facilities comparable to any in the United States.

"This gift is another example of Mr. Boshamer's tremendous interest in and loyalty to the University. It is something in which all Carolina baseball people will take pride. We are deeply grateful for his wonderful generosity to the athletic program and to the University."
