
Symposium Art Showing

"The metal sculptures blend in with the trees and become a part of the natural environment," he said. Conversely, he added, the trees themselves become a part of the whole theme of the exhibit. Each enhances the other.

Boggs, who taught sculpture last semester, now instructs arts and crafts. An art graduate of the University of Kentucky, he said he came to North Carolina because of its natural environment.

He pointed out that the color of the pieces, a light green, blends with the color of the plants and changes slightly as the season changes.
