Wuycik wins ACC honors in league's stormy week

In a tempest-ridden conference that promises to get stormier with each game, ACC writers again recognized the sturdiest helmsman on the leading ship Tuesday morning.

Dennis Wuycik piloted Carolina's Tar Heels past floundering South Carolina and Duke and earned "player of the week" honors for the second time this season.

The 6-5 junior, averaging 20.5 points a game and hitting 63 per cent of his shots,

went to the bench early in the Duke contest with a two-stitch cut over his left eye, but came back to perform his usual heroics.

The winds howled again Monday night as pre-season favorite South Carolina went down for the third time.

Virginia, catching the Gamecocks on its home court, stopped USC 50-49 as soph guard Barry Parkhill sank a medium-range jumper with four seconds to go.

The Cavaliers held the ball for two minutes after Kevin Joyce was called for travelling, then Parkhill hit the shot that

he knew "would go in the second I let it go."

Frank McGuire, growing more desperate with every minute, taught new heights at Charlottesville.

He drew a technical foul at halftime by showing John Hedberg of the Staunton "Leader." McGuire had charged Hedberg with "journalistic abuse" in recent stories.

After his critique of the area sportswriting, Frank went after the referees, saying that Joyce's travelling call was undeserved. "This would have never happened at Columbia," McGuire muttered. "Our boys are afraid to play now because of the refereeing calls."

Virginia hosts Wake Forest and State travels to Duke Wednesday night, and Clemson comes to UNC Thursday night.

The Tar Heels risk their unbeaten ACC record on the road Saturday afternoon at Wake, while Duke goes to Clemson and Georgia Tech journeys to Charlottesville.

Wake is getting its best play ever out of 6-7 center Gil McGregor, and any time Bob Rhoads and Neil Pastushok can join Charlie Davis in shooting streaks, the Deacons can match anybody.

Sara pin keys wrestling victory

UNC heavyweight Charley Sara, needing a decision over his opponent in the final bout of Monday night's wrestling match with Washington and Lee to prevent a Tar Heel loss, pinned Ray Fulchor to climax a dramatic 22-20 Carolina comeback victory in Carmichael Auditorium.

The Tar Heels, posting victories in six of the last seven weight classifications, fought back from the short end of a lopsided 20-3 count in posting their first win of the young season.

Washington and Lee spurred to a quick 5-0 lead as Mike Wilford pinned UNC sophomore Mike Barringer in the 118-pound class, and then went ahead by a seemingly insurmountable 15-0 margin as Carolina forfeited in the 126-lb and

within three points at 20-17, thus setting the stage for Sara's decisive triumph.

Sara needed at least a decision over Washington and Lee's Fulchor to give Carolina three points and a 20-20 tie, but the Arlington, Va., neatly pinned Fulchor with only 4:12 gone in their heavyweight bout to hand coach Sam Barnes' Tar Heels the 22-20 win.

UNC's Jack Ross then fell to the visitor's Bill Melton to drop Carolina behind at 20-3, but the Tar Heels rallied and swept the next five weight classifications.

After UNC team captain Luther Gartrell punted Jim Steiff 11-2 in the 158-lb class, Carolina freshman Gary Purcell pinned Bruce Hankins with 4:32 gone in their 167-lb bout to close the gap to nine at 20-11.

Sophomores Ricky Weisner (177) and Todd Parrish (190) then came through with 9-3 and 9-6 decisions over Washington and Lee's Dean Copenhaver and Mark Wrisley to put the Tar Heels

Rice upset by signs, bans distasteful ones

Carolina Athletic Director Homer Rice, upset by several distasteful signs he observed Saturday at the UNC-Duke game, appealed to students Monday to refrain from displaying such banners in the future.

He issued a statement warning that "any student who carries into Carmichael Auditorium a sign that would in any way embarrass the University, the athletic department or the basketball team, will be asked to leave and the sign will be confiscated."

Rice continued by appealing to students "to cooperate in this matter by upholding the best tradition of sportsmanship at Carolina."

He said he was disturbed by one sign in particular. The basketball game was being televised to a regional audience when the banner was paraded around the auditorium.

Rice also announced that tickets for the Carolina-Clemson game scheduled Thursday night remain available at the ticket office from 8:30-4:30 today.
