

# Heels, now 5-9, play Tigers twice

Clemson baseball coach Bill Wilhelm loves nothing more than a victory over Carolina—unless it's two victories.

In quest of that end, Wilhelm is expected to start his two best pitchers, Rusty Gerhardt and Dave Van Volkenburg, in today's doubleheader at Durham Athletic Park, starting at 1:00.

The Tar Heels, now 5-9 after a disappointing 4-3 loss at Davidson Thursday, will counter with southpaw Jim Chamberlain and righthander Dave Bullard.

"It was a miserable way to lose," admitted Coach Walter Rabb after the Davidson game.

"We lost it on errors—we hit the ball well, and then their players kept making outstanding catches. In addition, our pitchers only allowed them two hits."

Fred Gianiny started, followed by Dave Batts and Rusty Prindle.

Davidson first baseman Lynn Wagner drove in the only earned run for the Wildcats, as two walks and three errors gave them their other scores. All four Davidson runs came in the sixth inning.

Carolina loaded the bases in the second inning and did not score, and left

the tying run on base in the top of the ninth.

Larry Kiser went four for four, getting half of Carolina's hits. "When your hitting is concentrated in one spot like that," said Rabb, "it's hard to drive in runs."

Runs may be at a premium today for both sides.

Both Gerhardt and Von Volkenburg are smooth lefthanders, rated as two of the more complete pitchers in the ACC.

Gerhardt is rated slightly better than his companion. The Baltimore junior has led the conference in strikeouts the last two years, and struck out 24 in his first 21 innings this season.

Bullard has improved markedly from last season. He has 10 strikeouts in 16 innings, and his curve ball was a pivotal factor in Carolina's 11-9 win over Yale before spring break.

Chamberlain was hit hard at Florida Southern when he let pitches get too high, but Rabb has great faith in the freshman southpaw. He leads the Heels in ERA with 2.50 and has 22 strikeouts in 18 innings. His win-loss record is 1-2.

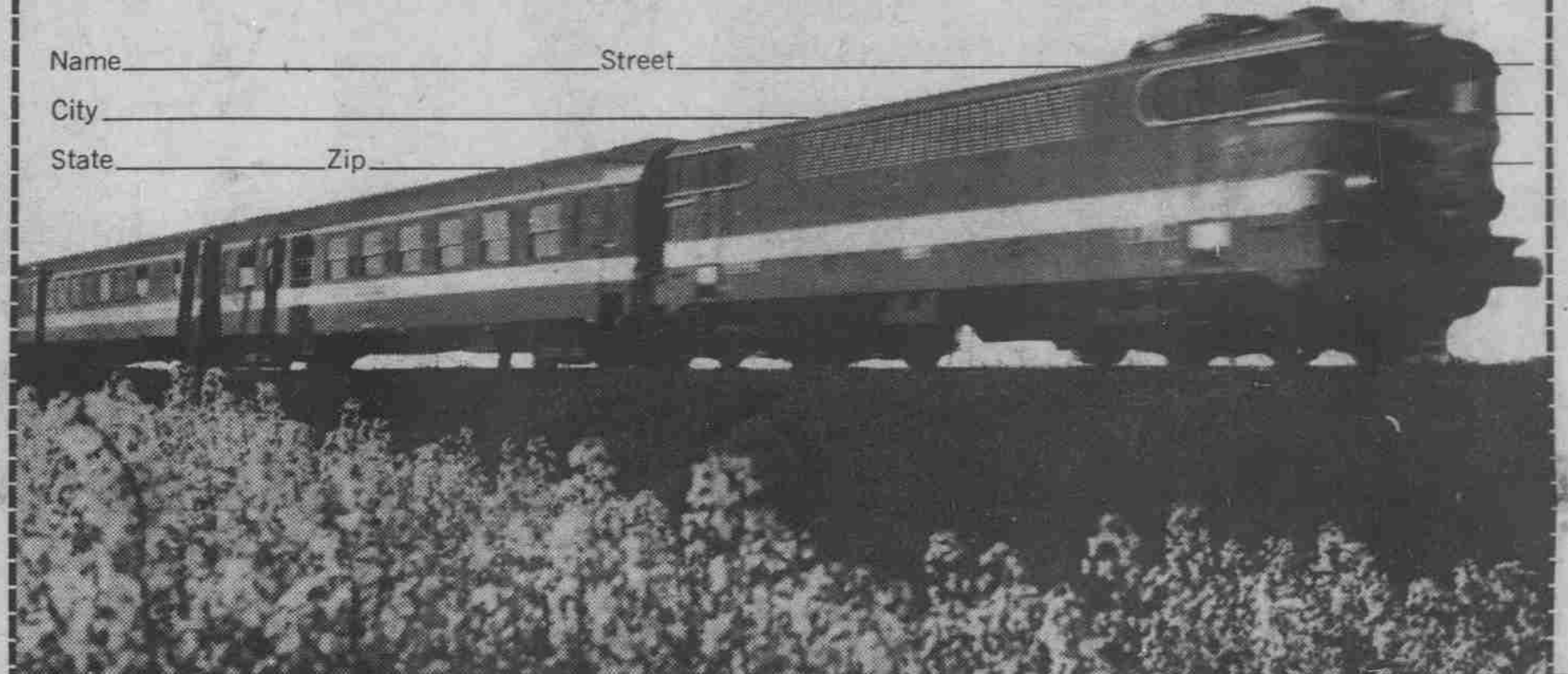
