

New pollution laws affect town

Chapel Hill might soon face substantial increases in its sewage treatment costs as a result of standards set by the Department of Air and Water Resources. Last week, the department announced the phosphorus discharges from the Haw and New Hope Rivers must be reduced by

90 per cent by 1973 to assure an acceptable quality of water in the New Hope Reservoir.

According to Col. George E. Pickett, department director, each of the 53 significant polluters of waters feeding the reservoir, including Chapel Hill, "will

have to modernize their equipment or build new treatment plants to bring themselves up to state pollution standards."

Chapel Hill Town Manager Robert Peck has not yet determined the steps the town will have to take in order to meet the department's standards.

"We haven't received any communication from the department on the standards, and I don't think they've been set," Peck said. "But it will cost us. We don't know how much yet, because we don't know what we will have to do to meet the standards."

This year's town budget allots \$46,000 for sewer plant operations.

Peck thinks the new process to remove phosphates will most likely involve chemical treatment, with only minor capital improvements to the town plant.

"The major cost will come in buying the chemicals and chemical distributors and in salaries," Peck said. "I estimate roughly \$40,000 to \$50,000 more a year."

The sewer treatment plant is now operated by one man on an 8 a.m.-5 p.m. schedule. However, with a more complicated chemical treatment process, it will be necessary to have around-the-clock shifts, seven days a week, Peck added.

The Chapel Hill Board of Aldermen must soon deal with the problem of where the money will come from to meet the new treatment costs.

Peck thinks a bond issue could provide money for initial capital improvement, but annual operating costs would have to come from the general fund (made up of property tax and sales tax revenues) or an increase in sewer charges.

Switchboard needs help in counseling

Switchboard, Chapel Hill's multi-purpose youth center and counseling service, has started its second year and needs volunteers, say directors Buck and Kay Goldstein.

The Goldsteins, who took the organization in May, are presently recruiting volunteers. They plan to start a training program Wednesday afternoon.

The center offers counseling services in such areas as drug information, draft counseling, job referrals, parent-child relationships and contraceptive needs.

Switchboard maintains 24-hour phone service. Its center of operations at 408 Rosemary St. stays open 18 hours a day. During the month of July,

Switchboard received 270 phone calls, and approximately 70 people made use of its facilities, according to Goldstein.

"We're reaching a whole range of diverse people," he said. "We are coordinating our efforts with the dorms through the resident advisors, as well as working with public schools and churches."

Switchboard was begun in March, 1970, by the Chapel Hill Drug Action Committee; it is currently funded by the Chapel Hill Board of Aldermen and Community Chest.

Board plans meeting on student vote

The tangled situation of student voting residency in Chapel Hill may come unraveled when the Orange County Elections Board holds an informal meeting today in Hillsborough.

Elections Commissioner Carolina Cody is expected to ask the board for guidance in registering students. At present, the board is registering students living off-campus who are willing to declare Chapel Hill as their legal residence.

Dorm residents must appear before the full board before a decision is made.

The board's current position is much more liberal than a recommended policy of State Elections Board Chairman Alex Brock "not to register students in their college towns."

The board is not expected to make any formal decision at its meeting today.


