

# Genesis House planning projects to raise money

Genesis House, a drug rehabilitation center near Chapel Hill, has several fund-raising projects planned this year, including solicitation of fraternity and sorority help.

Cathy Hollifield, a coordinator of the center, said officials of Genesis House will be talking to fraternities and sororities on campus or any other organized group to obtain their help in raising funds.

A similar program is underway at Duke University, she said, and some of the Duke fraternities and sororities have already responded to requests for help.

Other projects tentatively planned by Genesis House include an "All Sports Day" and include a possible telethon on a Charlotte television station.

The center raised \$867 at "All Sports Day" last year at Eastgate Shopping Center. Miss Hollifield said she hopes athletes from UNC, Duke and N. C. State will be included in this year's program.

Genesis House will be showing a film of the highlights of last year's UNC basketball games at campus dormitories in an additional effort to raise funds, she said.

UNC basketball guard George Karl will be working with the center this year, making speeches and handling public relations.

Dick Devenzio, a Duke guard, began the "Dribbling for Dollars" campaign last spring to raise money for the center. He dribbled across the state to gain publicity for Genesis House.

Since that time, the center has received more than \$25,000 in

contributions, Miss Hollifield said.

Genesis House, founded by a Chapel Hill pediatrician, Dr. Robert Senior, now houses 16 narcotic addicts. The center is located on a 130-acre farm seven miles west of Chapel Hill.

Miss Hollifield said the center plans to build houses for the treatment of additional addicts. Presently, five of the patients at the center are living in the loft of a barn, she said.

The patients at Genesis House have grown vegetables to raise money and also dug a well on the farm. They have about 100 sheep expected to add additional revenue.

They also plan to charge board for horse stalls presently under construction and to sell some handicrafts to supplement their income.

## Honorary checking students

"Any student wishing to join Phi Beta Kappa honorary society should go to the Office of Registration in Hanes Hall to see if they meet the eligibility requirements," says Dr. Claude George, associate dean of the School of Business Administration and advisor for the society.

"We have some 19,000 students here at UNC and although we pull everyone's file to check to see if he or she has the requirements, we often overlook a few people," said George.

The nationally recognized society was chartered on the UNC campus in 1904 and seeks to recognize "intellectual capacities well employed, especially in the liberal arts and sciences."

Requirements for the society differ with the academic standing of the student and his overall grade point average.

Juniors must have completed 75 hours of credit with a GPA of 3.6. Seniors must have 105 hours of academic credit, and a GPA of 3.3. Junior transfers must have transferred after two years and have at least 45 hours of credit and a GPA of 3.5.

Eligibility for the society may be checked with Mrs. Margaret Daniel in 105 Hanes Hall.
