Many offices help graduating seniors

The senior is faced with several decisions as he nears graduation. There are several offices on the UNC campus designed to help the student in making these decisions.

Information on career planning and placement, new trades, graduate school and travel abroad is available in these offices.

The Guidance and Testing Center, 019 Peabody, offers counseling and testing in various fields. Recent publications concerning career, graduate and further training can be found in the

Occupational and Educational Information Library, 013 Peabody.

The University Placement Service, 211 Gardner Hall, offers on-campus interviews with employers from all phases of government, business, industry and other private organizations. The service also provides specific job leads for those seeking employment in a particular location.

Students may register with the service for a permanent placement folder containing resumes and references. This information can be mailed out with applications to prospective employers. The Placement Service urges students to register for these folders immediately.

Social service opportunities information can be obtained at two locations. Information and

applications for Peace Corps, VISTA, and Teacher Corps are available at the campus YMCA office in Y Building. The Peace Corps regional office is at the Wesley Foundation. The Placement Service office has a "VISTA Fact Book."

"Invest Yourself," a 66-page booklet at the Y office, gives information on work opportunities in community development and individual service. Information on alternative service possibilities for conscientious objectors is included.

The placement office has copies of "New School Exchange Newsletter" and "Vocations for Social Change."

"American Crafts Council Directory of Crafts Courses" and the Technical Institute files are located in 013 Peabody.

Information on jobs in the Chapel Hill area can be found at the placement office, Personnel Office at 013 Battle and the intern's quarters at N.C. Memorial Hospital.

The N.C. Employment Security Commission at 516 N. Mangum Street and Manpower, Inc., at 803 E. Ramseur St., both in Durham, concern temporary work.

Graduate School admission tests applications are in 019 Peabody. Other graduate school information includes general guides, 013 Peabody and the Placement Service; catalogues, the Wilson Library B.A. and S.S. Reading Room; and the Arts and Sciences bulletin board, 2nd floor South Building.

The Teacher Placement Bureau is at 103 Peabody. The Placement

Office has information on teaching at the college level.

Work-study travel information can be found in 013 Peabody, the Arts and Sciences Bulletin Board, the Dey Hall bulletin board and the placement service.

The International Student Center helps students with travel information.

Statements of health and immunization shots for travel can be obtained at the Student Health Service.

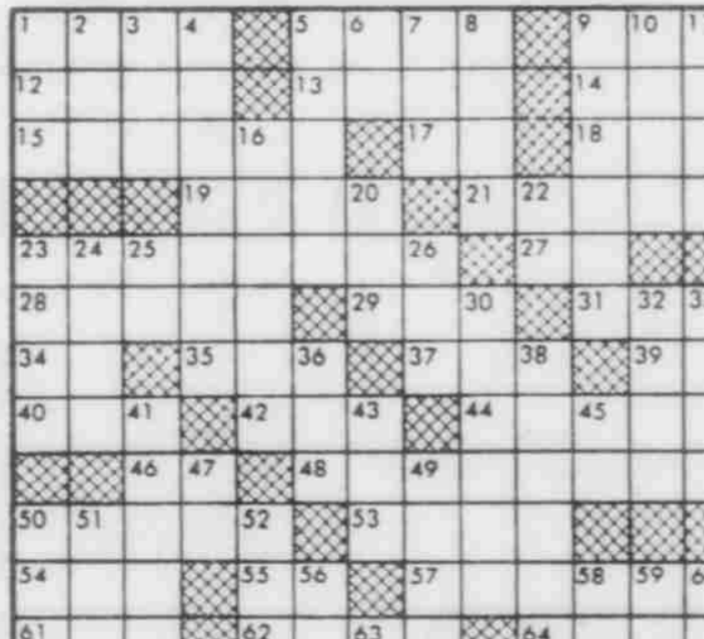
