

Swimming team opens today against Devils

The practices started early with almost the entire squad working out individually. The enthusiasm has been plentiful and everyone seems to have improved over last season.

Forward Bill Chamberlain was suspended from Carolina's basketball team before Friday night's intrasquad scrimmage, not because of it as erroneously reported in the Daily Tar Heel Tuesday.

Chamberlain, last year's most valuable player in the National Invitation Tournament, was placed on suspension last week before the scrimmage was held. It came as a result of a practice incident which was not clarified by the coaching staff.

Fall, however, is only for practices; the real test starts today when the Tar Heels open their season against Duke at Boman Gray Pool. The meet will begin at 4 p.m.

It seems as though everyone connected with the swimming team has been caught up in the overwhelming enthusiasm the team has displayed. This includes veteran Head Coach Pat Earey.

"I think probably we have had one of the best practice seasons ever," Coach Earey said. "This is due largely to the strength of the enthusiasm and desire of the co-captains Ron Nagel and Gerry Chapman."

"If desire makes the difference then I think we should have an outstanding season."

Coach Earey feels the major objective of the opening Duke meet is to give each swimmer a chance to gain a perspective for the season. He said that probably every member of the team will see action during the contest.

"Both us and Duke this meet as an opportunity to test what we have been working on," he said. "It is used mainly to get a line on what to expect and to break the ice."

Coach Earey indicated that his team will hit a tough spot in the schedule early when they face both Maryland and Navy this weekend. The Heels will travel to Annapolis this Saturday and then College Park next Monday.

"These two meets should give us a good line on our potential this season," Coach Earey said. "If we could win against these two teams, who are probably favored on paper, it would give us a tremendous incentive for the rest of the season."

There have been no major surprises during the practices, Coach Earey said, but he felt almost everyone has improved. "We have had most of the people to live up to expectation."

"Peter Bonds has done better at this stage than he had at this stage last season," he said, "and I think Mike Southard has improved also."

"Then too, Dave Bedell is coming off a very successful summer it should help his performance this season."
