Kadar's 'Adrift' haunting

If your first exposure to "Adrift" was the Playboy spread on Paula Pritchett skinnydipping in the Danube, then you're probably well acquainted with the natural resources of both actress and location in this new, rather haunting film by Czech filmmaker Jan Kadar.

Kadar, who first received recognition in his own country in 1952 when he won the Czechoslovakian State Prize for "Hijacking", did not become widely known in the United States until his much celebrated "Shop on Main Street" in 1964. "Adrift", which is his latest film, was shot on location in Bratislava between 1968 and 1970, with one long halt in production coming immediately after the Russian invasion.

The film begins, in the sense that this is the opening scene, with a fisherman (Janos) returning home with medicine for his ill wife. As he is preparing to administer it, a shout comes from the river informing him that a woman (Anada) has taken her life. Janos rushes out to search for her, but after combing the river in his boat for hours, he finally washes ashore exhausted.

At this point we are introduced to a group of men who are gathered around a campfire—men whom we later learn Janos has already met in town. There, amidst an underworld setting of darkness and fire, Janos begins to tell the story of his infatuation with this mysterious Anada: how he fished her out of the water, fell in

love with her, and finally lost her to the river again.

The film alternates between the bright, lyrical snatches of Janos' story and the dark, almost menacing tones of the nocturnal gathering. Almost like the chorus in a Greek tragedy, the travellers interrogate Janos, comment on him, console him. Is he dead, we wonder, and is this a purgatory in which some sort of judgment will be passed? Is this Janos' final reckoning?

Kadar doesn't exactly tell us, but in an

unusually photographed back projection sequence, we do become aware of the barrier which now exists between Janos and his previous life. As the fisherman runs toward his home in this final scene, the house itself seems to draw away; the harder he runs, the faster it seems to recede.

The vivid contrast in tone which is drawn between the bright narrative segments and the underworld exchanges is carefully underscored by Vladimir Novotny's fine cinematography. The fire light discovers alternately threatening and

sympathetic caverns in the faces of the inquisitors, and the river shots, particularly the river families rowing through the morning fog, manage to capture the sense of mystery about the river, both as giver and taker of life, which is central to the film.

"Adrift" features Yugoslavian actress Milena Dravic as the lovely but simple wife, Rade Marcovic as the fisherman Janos, and American model-turned-actress Paula Pritchett as the exotic stranger whose voice, perhaps mercifully, is dubbed over in Czech.

Mary Travers scheduled for Carmichael Saturday

Mary Travers, formerly of "Peter, Paul and Mary" and now recording and performing on her own, will appear in Carmichael Auditorium Saturday night. Tickets for the 8 p.m. concert are still available in the Union for \$1.50.

A member of the famous recording trio with Peter Yarrow and Paul Stookey since 1961, Travers is the first to break away from the group. Her first solo LP, "Mary," was released last February by Warner Bros. Records.

Born in Louisville, Kent., Travers moved to Greenwich Village at an early age with her writer-parents. At the age of 20 she was a member of a folksinging group named "The Songswappers," which was greatly influenced by the work of Pete Seeger. In 1958, Travers appeared in the short-running Broadway musical, "The Next President."

Finally, in 1961, she joined with Yarrow and Stookey to form Peter, Paul and Mary. The trio's first big-selling single, "Puff, the Magic Dragon," won the group an invitation to appear before President John F. Kennedy at the White House.

Peter, Paul and Mary became mildly controversial during this period when they released Bob Dylan's "Blowin' in the Wind," a civil-rights song that was eventually banned in South Africa and parts of the American South. The group

tried to live up to its image, performing at various demonstrations such as Dr. Martin Luther King's 1963 March on Washington.

During her years with Peter, Paul and Mary, Travers sang before approximately seven million people on three continents and appeared on numerous television programs. Some of their popular songs included, "I Dig Rock 'n' Roll Music," "Lemon Tree," "500 Miles," and "If I Had a Hammer." In the late 1960s the group declined in popularity, though the trio did record a million-selling single, "Leaving On a Jet Plane," in 1969.

When Peter, Paul and Mary finally broke up in 1970, Travers found herself performing alone, a situation she accepts philosophically.

"No matter how much support you're getting or giving," she says, "when it's your time, when the moment of truth comes, you're always alone."
