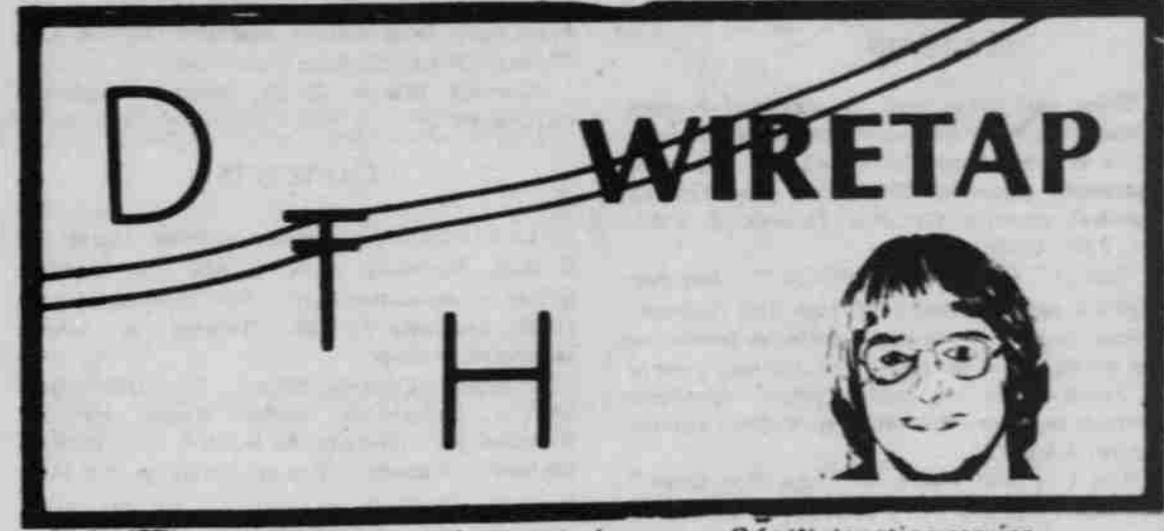
The class meets from seven to nine p.m. Tuesday and Thursday evenings. It costs \$2.50.

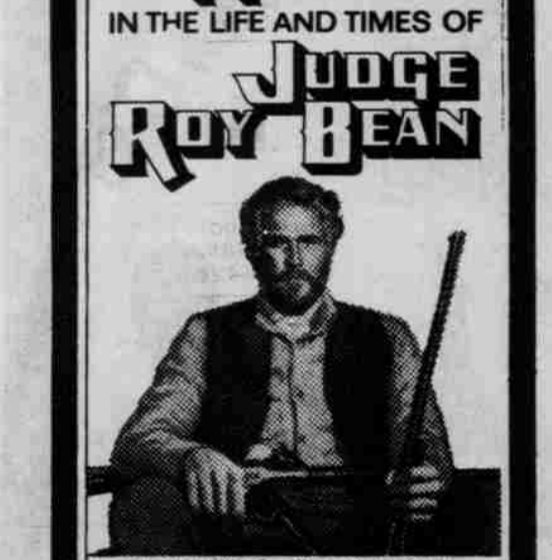

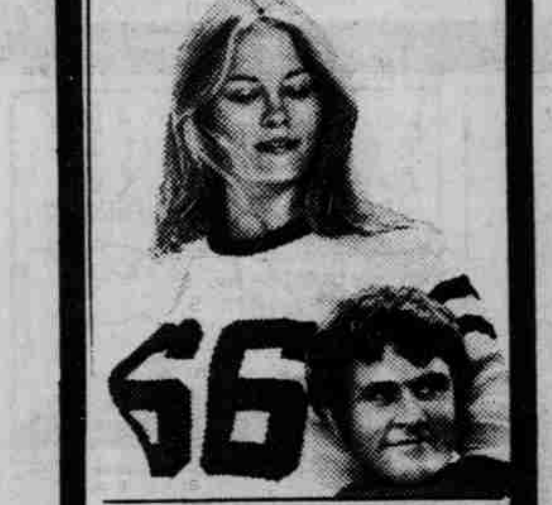
