Two Chapel Hill groups participating in World Food Day Committee on World Hunger scheduled for 7:30 tonight. today are planning activities to draw attention to the problems of world hunger. The food day is sponsored nationwide by the Center for Science in the Public Interest, based in Washington, D.C.

The UNC Starvathon Committee is encouraging students to fast and contribute money they would have spent on food to a special fund to help feed the starving.

Contributions can be turned in to the UNC YM-YWCA. The money raised by the committee will be added to over \$5400 already collected by the group.

Thirty per cent of the money raised will be distributed to the hungry in North Carolina through Church Women United. The other 70 per cent will go to UNICEF for distribution in Bangladesh.

The Starvathon Committee also has invited interested students to attend an organizational meeting of a Hunger Action Committee at noon on Wednesday, April 23, in the YMCA building.
