
LaGarde named to U.S. squad

North Carolina's Tommy LaGarde has been selected to the 12man Intercontinental Cup basketball squad which will represent the United States in Europe this summer, Cliff B. Fagan, President of the Amateur Basketball Association of America, announced Tuesday.

The intercontinental competition, which serves as a preliminary for the 1976 Montreal Olympics, includes six games against four of the world's best national teams. The squad was selected by the ABA-USA Games Committee at the Pan-American trials in Salt Lake City, Utah, in early June.

Other players named were Wayne Rollins from Clemson; Robert Parrish, Centenary; Leon Douglaus, Alabama; Mark Olberding, Minnesota; Norm Cook, Kansas; Ernie Grunfeld, Tennessee; John Davis, Dayton; Bruce Parkinson, Purdue; Rudy White, Arizona State; Ron Lee, Oregon; and Joe Hassett, Providence. UNC's Mitch Kupchak was also reportedly chosen but declined the invitation for personal



The squad returns to the United States on August 9 with games scheduled against the Greeks and Yugoslavs August 12-14 at an undetermined site. On August 16 the U.S. squad will play the Italians in the Providence Civic Center and wind up the competition August 19 against the Russians in Greensboro Coliseum.

Sports briefs

Carolina signs six top prep wrestlers

Six of the country's top high school wrestlers, including two national champions, have signed athletic grantin-aids with the University of North Carolina.

Tar Heel Coach Bill Lam announced the lineup and said, "It has been an unbelievable recruiting year for us."

Heading the list of signees are Chris Conkwright and Mike Newbern, national champions from Virginia Beach, Va. Conkwright received more than 60 scholarship offers and it is believed he was the most highlyrecruited wrestler in the nation.

Wrestling at the 134-pound weight, Conkwright won the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) championship and was a first team All-American. He was a threetime state champion in Virginia.

Newbern is a 150-pounder who was a national prep champion at Blair Academy in New Jersey. He was a member of the United States team which wrestled in competition against Russia.

Other wrestlers who will be entering Carolina in the fall on scholarships are Dean Brior, 185-pounder from Havertown, Pa., who won his state

from Norfolk, Va., who was a state champion at Norview High School and also competed against the Russian team; Dave Jergens, 145-pound state champion from Rochester, N.Y., who won 65 matches and lost three in his high school career; and Joe Ryan, 158pounder from Catholic Central High in Detroit, Mich., a two-time runnerup in the state finals.

UNC sophomore Ralph King has been selected to run in the Russian-American Junior Track Meet at Lincoln, Neb., July 4-5. King, a native of Atlanta, Ga., will compete in the 5,000 meter run. He recently set a new junior record in that event with a time of 14:11.7 at Knoxville, Tenn.

Manager. Home games scheduled in Kenan September 20, Notre Dame on October 11. East Carolina on October 25, Wake Forest November I and Clemson on November 8.

Individual game tickets are marked \$8, except for the Notre Dame game which will be \$10 per ticket. Out-oftown games will also be \$8 a ticket, except the Virginia game which will be marked \$7 a ticket.

Season tickets will range from \$48 regular to \$51 in sections with seatbacks. Tickets may be ordered from the UNC Athletic Association, Box 2126, Chapel Hill, N.C. 27514. Add 50 cents for insurance and handling.

Catcher Danny Goodwin of Southern University was named the player of the year. Others named were righthanded pitcher Jim Gideon, Texas; lefthanded pitcher Floyd Bannister, Arizona State; second baseman Bryan Jones, Iowa; shortstop Bill Hiss, Queens; outfielder Condredge Holloway, Tennessee; third baseman Jerry Maddox, Arizona State; and outfielder Dave Stegman, Arizona.

Nine Carolina basketball games will be televised next season, according to a schedule tentatively approved by Atlantic Coast Conference officials.

They are among 19 conference games to be produced by Castleman D. Chesley, who has presented these telecasts for the past 18 seasons. The January 18 N.C. State game at Chapel Hill falls on Super Bowl Sunday and will be aired nationally at 12:30 p.m. preceding the football telecast. The telecasting of the February 21 game against Virginia and the February 28 game against Duke will be subject to the team's conference standing at the time.
