fighting a windmill until we know exactly what we're up against."

Friday asked HEW last week to postpone the March 1 deadline so that the universities could have some input into the plan. Friday has since heard nothing from HEW, and he was not informed Tuesday of the delay.

He said he believes that the present UNC desegregation plan, approved by HEW in June

1974, is a good one, and that UNC has exceeded its requirements so far.

In its budget, the UNC system has requested \$3 million for the next two years to further eliminate racial duality in the system. The money, which must be approved by the General Assembly, would be used partially for grants to black faculty members for doctoral studies.


