Anita Bryant—from orange juice to chasing gays

Appearances, especially in this case can be deceptive, for the lady is fire. Anita Bryant's fanaticism about orange juice has carried over into a new realm. Now, instead of rallying about round, seeded pulp, she attacks those deemed as "sexually abnormal."

Everyone, regardless of his feelings about Anita Bryant, must admit that she deserves applause for the methods she used to overturn a Dade County (Florida) ordinance. This ordinance would have prohibited housing and employment discrimination based on sexual affections or preference.

The methodology: appeal to emotions, not facts, get a Bible, associate with fire and brimstone preachers, shed buckets of tears, and there you have it—the perfect scenario.

This, however, is not a play and its consequences to homosexuals is reality.

Author Merle Miller, a homosexual was quoted in Newsweek as saying, "We may be moving to another McCarthy era; this time the enemy won't be Communism—it will be sex."

Sure enough, there has been, according to Bruce Vaelley, co-executive director of the National Gay Task Force, a "flurry of firings of homosexuals in Dade County." Bryant did not defeat the ordinance alone; she did it with the help of thousands of Miamians who, though rightfully concerned about the effect homosexuality would have on children, were gullible enough to be swept into Bryant's unjustifiable viciousness towards those not heterosexual.
