Council to re-evaluate 'XYC' issue

The Campus Governing Council will retackle the issue of WXYC funding tonight and also will consider a referendum on a constitutional amendment that drastically would change the organization and powers of the executive branch of Student Government.

The CGC will meet at 5:30 p.m. today in Room 213 of the Carolina Union.

Two bills which collectively would allocate approximately \$13,000 to WXYC top the agenda. The first bill would allocate \$9,956.75 to the radio station for FM construction and capital improvements such as shelving, headphones and soundproofing.

This bill also would grant \$2,000 to WXYC for programming.

The second bill would appropriate \$1,994.85 to the station: \$789.85 for current operation expenses and \$1,215.07 for a news service.

The news service includes a 20-week subscription to a newswire service, according to the WXYC news department.

The CGC may approve a constitutional referendum which would pose, to the students, the question of electing the Student Government treasurer.

The referendum, which would be held Feb. 14, also would bring before students the question of removing the student body president as a voting member of the CGC and the CGC Finance Committee. It also

would put the treasurer on the Finance Committee as a non-voting ex officio member.

The referendum would require the treasurer to make monthly reports to the CGC on the current state of Student Government finances.

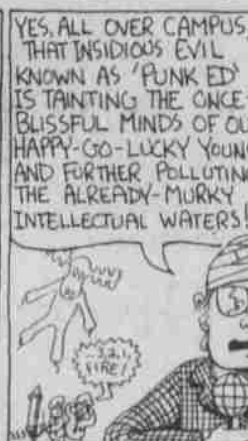
The bylaws of the CGC now stipulate that the Finance Committee chairperson will make such reports. CGC Speaker Chip Cox said he hoped such reports would be made.

Anarchist Hess to speak Wednesday night in Memorial

Karl Hess, self-proclaimed anarchist and former adviser to Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., will speak at 8 p.m. Wednesday in Memorial Hall.

Hess will arrive in Chapel Hill today and is scheduled to hold press conferences and speak to various campus organizations.

A man of varied careers ranging from press editor of *Newsweek* to writer of Republican national platforms to welder of sculptures, Hess also is a man whose political philosophy has changed. Once a conservative right-hand man to Goldwater, he now calls himself an

anarchist.

Hess explains anarchism as being a condition with an absence of rule in which the basic unit of civilization is the neighborhood, not the state or country. In keeping with this belief, he tried to organize an inner-city Washington, D.C., neighborhood into a self-sustaining community.

The high-school dropout also dropped out of the political arena after Goldwater's unsuccessful bid for the presidency. He then refused to pay his taxes, and his property was confiscated by the Internal Revenue Service, as is any money he earns.
