
One of the students interviewed was senior David Ascher, Ascher, who is white, said Straight asked him how he picked UNC-CH. if he had considered attending a traditionally black university and whether Ascher thinks he would have felt uncomfortable or like a member of a minority had he attended a black school. Ascher said he felt Straight was seeking examples of Southern prejudice.

Straight also interviewed Jimmy Dixon, a freshman. Dixon said Straight did not mention HEW or its demands on the N.C. University System in the interview.
