The 63 -year-old leader said at a news

said he would be available for the largely ceremonial job of president. A caucus of Vorster's National Party, to meet Sept. 28 in Cape Town to pick new president and prime mininster. The new prime minister likely will face ecision on Namibia.

Common Cause has been involved nationally in the movement for passage of ERA, although the national group has not been involved actively in the lobbying
