Wolfpack, Tar Heels ready to tangle

One year ago at Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh, Carolina, which had led State by 21 at halftime looked like a certain loser as the final seconds were ticking away. Only Dudley Bradley, who did not want to lose, stole the ball from Clyde Austin and raced downcourt for a dunk. The game was Carolina's.

They haven't forgotten about Bradley's exploits of last winter. State is as hyped up as it ever is when the Tar Heels are coming to play in Reynolds. In fact, two groups of student waiting in line for tickets to today's 7 p.m. game got involved in a scuffle Sunday and officials postponed ticket distribution until today.

The Wolfpack players will join their supporters in being ready for North Carolina. Amid rumors and speculation that coach Norm Sloan will leave Raleigh for the head coaching position at the University of Florida, the team has continued to play well.

The Pack enters the game with a 7-5 record in the Atlantic Coast Conference and an 18-6

overall mark. UNC is 8-4 and 19-5.

"The game has a lot of interesting angles in addition to it being a State-Carolina clash," Sloan said. "There'll be matchups of all-conference candidates, and a matchup of Player-of-the-Year candidates."

Carolina forward Al Wood suffered a slight fracture of his right index finger in practice Tuesday afternoon and is questionable for tonight's game.

The injury is not serious but is painful. Wood will warm up before the game, and the decision whether he will play will be made then.

for making the Pack's year turn out better than observers thought possible before the season began.

"It's a big, big game from many points of view," Sloan said, noting the importance as far as the ACC race is concerned.

Whitney is the only State player scoring in double figures at 18.8 points a game. Austin averages nearly nine points a game and is followed by guard Kenny Matthews at eight points per contest.

- The contest is open to all amateur photographers who are 18 years old or older and/or are undergraduate or graduate students of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Members of the staffs of any University of North Carolina Student Publications are not eligible. For the purposes of *The Daily Tar Heel* Photographic Contest, amateur photographers are defined as those photographers who do not support themselves or receive a large share of their personal income due to the sale of photographic services or images.
- Any subject matter is acceptable for entry. Entries will be judged on (A) Content, (B) Technical Quality—which includes cropping, contrast, sharpness and lack of flaws in developing and printing; and (C) Visual Impact.
- Entrants may submit a maximum of five (5) entries for each of the contest's two major categories provided each entry is accompanied by the entrant's name, address and phone number.
- CATEGORIES
 - BLACK AND WHITE**
Entries must be black and white prints at least 8 x 10 inches and no larger than 11 x 14 inches. Prizes will be awarded for first, second and third places.
 - COLOR**
Entries must be color prints at least 8 x 10 inches and no larger than 11 x 14 inches. Prizes will be awarded for first, second and third places.
 - BEST-IN-SHOW**
All entries which meet the above qualifications will be considered for the award as "Best-In-Show."
- PRIZES
The First Place entry in either major category will be awarded a \$75 gift certificate to be redeemed at a photographic store to be named by *The Daily Tar Heel*. The Second Place entry in either category will be awarded a \$50 gift certificate. The Third Place entry in either category will be awarded a \$25 gift certificate. The entry that is named "Best-In-Show" will receive a \$100 gift certificate. No entry can win both "Best-In-Show" and First Place in either category.
Honorable mention in both the Black and White and Color categories will be named at the discretion of the judges.
- All entries will be judged by a panel of judges selected by *The Daily Tar Heel*. The decision of the judges will be final.
- All winning entries must be mounted by the entrants for display after selection. Winning entries will be displayed at Foister's Camera Store and University Mall.
- All entries must reach *The Daily Tar Heel* office no later than March 14, 1980.
- Winners will be required to submit the original negatives or slides of the winning photographs before the prizes are awarded. Failure to comply with this rule may result in disqualification.
- The Daily Tar Heel* will not be responsible for any claim or complaint from models used in winning photographs. Such responsibility is deemed to be that of the entrant. If necessary *The Daily Tar Heel* may request the entrant concerned to submit a release statement signed by the model before the prize is awarded.
- Non-winning entries may be picked up at *The Daily Tar Heel* office during regular office hours. Winners will be notified when they may pick up their entries.
- All possible care will be taken in handling all entries. *The Daily Tar Heel* will not assume responsibility for loss or damage of any entries.
- In the event an award-winning photograph is later found to have violated any contest rule, *The Daily Tar Heel* reserves the right to take any action it may deem suitable, including the return of the prize or prizes awarded. Also, the winning position will be voided.
