

Athletes don't like 'dumb jock' image

"I cringe at the word 'jock'."
"Football players are not all wild-as-hell, he-men who like to beat up people."
"If people find out you're an athlete, immediately they think your whole life revolves around sports."

Steve Junkmann was doing fine in freshman English until the day he wore a UNC football jersey to class. After that, he received an F on every paper he turned in. The football office arranged to have a Ph. D. candidate in English submit a paper under Junkmann's name. That paper, too, received an F.

Junkmann's comments and tale were expressed Monday as six UNC athletes spoke at a forum titled, "Self-Perceptions of Men and Women Athletes," part of a week-long program on "Perspectives on Masculinity and Femininity in the 1980s." The program is being sponsored by the Human Relations Committee of the Carolina Union and the Association for Women Students.

Junkmann, an All-Atlantic Coast Conference tackle, was joined on the panel by Fritz Homans of the men's swim team, Chris Heyn of the soccer team, Mary Holzer of the field hockey

and diving teams, Lindsey Linker of the women's tennis team and Bonny Brown of the women's swim team.

"A while ago I never would've dreamed of sitting up here and talking like this, but meeting people through football and communicating with teammates and coaches on a day-to-day basis has helped me overcome shyness," Junkmann said.

Holzer said "You learn to go out and put your all into everything. You learn to bounce back from defeat. You learn leadership and the limits of time."

All six athletes said they objected to the stereotypes and negative images some students and professors hold about athletes, but they all agreed no special favors should be expected from teachers.

"It's so easy to tag a sport, sorority, race or whatever on somebody," Brown said. "I stress getting to know someone on the basis of their personality. I like to be known as Bonny Brown, not Bonny Brown-swimmer."

"It's tough to be in a sorority and be an athlete," Linker said. "At first I just let my letter jacket hang in the closet. I see sports as an interest. Some people like to knit, some people like to play the piano. I like to run and play tennis. That shouldn't detract from my femininity."

Chris Heyn said he has the double problem of being an out-of-stater and an athlete. "Sometimes I feel like an outsider. Around athletes, some people have a superiority complex because they think you're a dumb jock and some have an inferiority complex because maybe they can't do what you can athletically."

All six athletes said sports participation has enhanced their undergraduate careers, despite the sacrifices.

Homers help Heels past Hawks

A solo home run by Chris Pittaro and a grand slam homer by Craig Shumock highlighted a 12-hit attack and relievers James Parks and Franklin Roberts pitched 7 1/3 scoreless innings as UNC beat UNC-Wilmington 10-3 Tuesday.

The second game of the scheduled day-night double-header in Boshamer Stadium was called off because of cold weather.

Pittaro's homer came in the seventh inning, and gave the Tar Heels a 5-3 lead. Shumock's homer came in the eighth, when the Heels broke the game open with five runs.

The Seahawks jumped on UNC starter Mike Brewer for three runs in the second

inning. Parks relieved with two outs and got out of a bases loaded jam en route to pitching 3 1/3 scoreless innings. Roberts entered the game in the sixth and gave up three hits.

Pittaro, who had three RBIs, Lloyd Brewer, Dwight Lowry and Scott Bradley all had two hits in the game as all but one of the Carolina starters had at least one hit.

Bradley's two hits extended his hitting streak to 24 games.

UNC, now 31-12, plays Wake Forest in Winston-Salem today. UNC-Wilmington dropped to 6-19 with the loss.

Stickmen face UMBC on road

The North Carolina lacrosse team faces the University of Maryland-Baltimore County in a rare midweek game at 2 p.m. Wednesday in Baltimore.

The Tar Heels are coming off a sluggish 10-6 win over Duke Saturday while UMBC, the top-ranked team in Division II, saw its record drop to 5-2 with a weekend loss to Towson State.

UNC coach Willie Scroggs said he hopes the team will turn in a better performance than the one Saturday. "I hope we play with more intensity than we did against Duke," he said. "UMBC is a much more physical and talented team than Duke."

Despite the win over Duke, the Tar Heels fell to sixth in the national rankings. Virginia maintained its position at the top with a victory over Maryland. Syracuse upset Rutgers to vault past Carolina to fourth.

Carolina returns to Chapel Hill for the last home game of the season against Roanoke at 2 p.m. Saturday on Fetzer Field.
