Cable television now available in area

Cable television is now available in the Chapel Hill-Carrboro area.

Village Cable, which serves Chapel Hill, should complete installation throughout the town by Dec. 1, said George Grills, director of engineering for Village Cable.

Subscribers to Village Cable may receive as many as 35 channels. Offered in various packages include the Entertainment and Sports Programming Network, an all-sports channel expanding to 24-hours a day in September; WTBS, Atlanta, Ted

Turner's "Superstation"; and the Cable News Network, a 24-hour news channel.

Current plans do not call for dormitories to be hooked up to cable. However, Grills said that Odum Village, married-student housing, has a master antenna system already completed. A cable company would have to run only one connection to hook up Odum Village.

"We hope to serve the campus in the future," said Jim Heavner, president of Village Cable. For now, Heavner said,

Village is trying to finish servicing the town.

Carrboro residents are served by Alert Cable TV. Viewers are offered 14 channels of various programming.

Included in this package are the Christian Broadcasting Network, a 24-hour religious channel; WGN-Chicago, which televises Chicago Cubs and Bulls games; and Nickelodeon, a children's channel.

Both cable systems are attempting to service other areas of Orange County not presently covered, Grills said.
