There are 28 emergency call boxes on the UNC campus, maintained by Southern Bell.

"We have been aware that the town was planning to cut (the boxes) off for some time," Steve Harward, UNC telephone systems engineer, said.

Harward said that recommendations for a new emergency system have been made by a committee appointed by John Temple, vice chancellor for business and finance.

Student body president Bob Saunders and Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs Donald Boulton have already sent in recommendations for modernizing the system.

Until a new system is installed, campus boxes will be tied directly into campus police headquarters in the basement of the Campus Y.

"Our problem now is that we don't know how much trouble we have," Harward said. "In the past, they (the boxes) were not monitored too closely." He said that vandalism to the boxes is not always reported and that testing for working order through the system itself is not very accurate.

Harward said that campus police have begun patrolling one round each night to check for vandalism.

Harward said that once a new system is decided upon, it will take at least a month or two before the work on the boxes is finished.

Orientation counselors ready for 1980

After a summer full of orientation offerings, and a year's worth of planning, freshmen and transfer students are expected to arrive in Chapel Hill Sunday, Aug. 17. Individual meetings with academic advisers are scheduled for the following morning and attendance is mandatory.



As many as 100 counselors will be assigned to an "area," or cluster of dorms, depending on the size of the location. It is hoped that the emphasis on "areas" will give new students a "sense of community and not just of dormitory," Johnson said.

Counselors will conduct tours and organize area activities, such as dinner outings and talent show.

Morrison area, for instance, is planning volleyball tournament, dance classes, parties, dinners, a movie and more. Advisory sessions will be held to discuss time management and registration, but the greater part of the focus is on fun, Lynn Worth, Morrison area coordinator, said.

Before new students arrive, counselors will correspond with them by mail, giving them seasoned advice about what to bring to UNC.
