All refrigerators rented

Because of a shortage of refrigerators and a higher demand for them, the Student Services Commission has run out of refrigerators to rent, Jane Hornaday, director of the commission, said Tuesday.

"We've delivered 323 and will get about 70 more in a second shipment. Those that come in the next shipment are available only to students who have paid the down payment," she said.

The commission rents the refrigerators from Collegiate Services Corporation and is having trouble

getting more refrigerators from them, she said.

"We can't get as many refrigerators as we need. CPI doesn't have any more," Linda Howey, assistant director, said.

Hornaday attributed the raise in demand for refrigerators to the new housing rule that forbids use of full-size refrigerators in university housing.

The commission annually rents 430 refrigerators from CPI, but it has lost some and others need repair, so it has less than usual.

"There are refrigerators for which we have no record of their location. We took over in second session of summer school and we don't know where some of the refrigerators are," Hornaday said.

The commission will buy the lost units rather than continue to rent them, she said.

The commission's office will be open today from 3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Thursday from 2:15 p.m. to 4:15 p.m. for students who have paid their down payment and need to pay the remainder of the bill. Also, students who cancel their order by this afternoon will receive refunds, Hornaday said.

The Student Services Commission falls under the jurisdiction of Student Government and the Residence Hall Association.
