DURHAM-Duke football coach Red Wilson was being very candid with members of the Atlantic Coast Conference Operation Football tour. "I didn't put out that bumper sticker that said 'Red Means Go'," Wilson said. "Heavens no!"

In all probability, enthusiasm for the Duke football program will not come up to the "Red Means Go" or "Devilerium" levels advertised on the bumper stickers last year. 




