

Loss caused a bruised ego, Crum says

North Carolina football coach Dick Crum says the biggest injury his team suffered in a 41-7 loss to Oklahoma last Saturday isn't something that can be treated by conventional medicine.

"Normally when you're defeated that badly, about half your people come out of the game in ambulances," Crum told reporters Tuesday at his weekly news conference. "But the most serious injury we had was a bruised ego."

The Tar Heels had a long afternoon at Norman's Owen Field as the Sooners ran for 493 yards against the vaunted Carolina defense and bounced UNC from the undefeated ranks.

But there was no mourning at Crum's news conference, and no one was making any excuses. Businesslike has become a catch-phrase around Kenan Fieldhouse this year and it was business as usual for Crum and his players Tuesday.

"The Oklahoma game is over with now," tight end Shelton Robinson said. "Now, we have to prepare for Clemson. The most important thing right now is winning the Atlantic Coast Conference."

"I don't think the Oklahoma game was the most important game of our season," Crum said. "Our conference games are much more important."

Crum brushed aside the first loss of the season much as he had brushed aside the seven preceding wins. Crum said the Sooners were able to defeat Carolina so soundly because of their great execution.

"Oklahoma operated the wishbone as effectively as that offense can be run," he said. "They have such great speed that the linemen don't have to hold the blocks long before they're by you."

"The thought that came was 'How can these people have two losses,'" he added. "They could have beaten just about anybody in the country Saturday."

As a result of the loss, Crum and the Tar Heels are now faced with the

challenge of bouncing back against Clemson, a team Carolina hasn't beaten since 1976. The teams played to a tie in 1977 and Clemson has won the last two meetings.

"Clemson has been having ups and downs," Crum said. "They've settled down and the defense is a typical Clemson defense. We'll have to come back and play a very solid football game."

"We're not going to let one game get us down," Robinson said. "We'll be ready to play and we'll just try to go out and play like we did in our first seven games."

Crum said Tiger quarterback Homer Jordan is the key to the Tiger offense. "He has more speed than any of the I-formation quarterbacks we've faced."

As for the prospect of entering Clemson Memorial Stadium, fondly referred to as "Death Valley," Crum feels his team won't be intimidated.

"Anytime you get involved with playing games with the crowd, you can't win," Crum said. "It upsets your team and adds fuel to the flame."

"The Oklahoma crowd was pretty noisy," Tyress Bratton said. "Clemson can be loud, too, but I don't think it will bother us."

"Anytime you lose like we did, it hurts your pride," Bratton added. "You just want to play another game."

"The chance to be 11-0 is behind us now," Robinson said. "We just have to fight our hardest now to be 10-1."

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Irish No. 1 in poll; UNC tumbles to 14th

The Fighting Irish of Notre Dame replaced Alabama as the No. 1 team in this week's Associated Press college football poll, while North Carolina tumbled from sixth to 14th following its 41-7 loss to Oklahoma.

Notre Dame's climb to the top ended Alabama's seven-week stay at No. 1. The Crimson Tide was defeated 6-3 Saturday by Mississippi State.

Georgia, which defeated South Carolina 13-10, is at No. 2, followed by Florida State, Southern Cal, Nebraska, Alabama, Ohio State, UCLA, Pittsburgh and Penn State.

Notre Dame and Georgia are the only unbeaten, united teams left in Division I. Southern Cal is 6-0-1.

Oklahoma tops the second 10, followed by Michigan, Brigham Young, North Carolina, South Carolina, Baylor, Purdue, Southern Methodist, Mississippi State and Florida.
