Blanc has also entertained millions as the voice of Yosemite Sam, Foghorn Leghorn, Speedy Gonzales, Barney Rubble, Sylvester the Cat, Pepe LePew and the jack-hammer laugh of Woody Woodpecker.

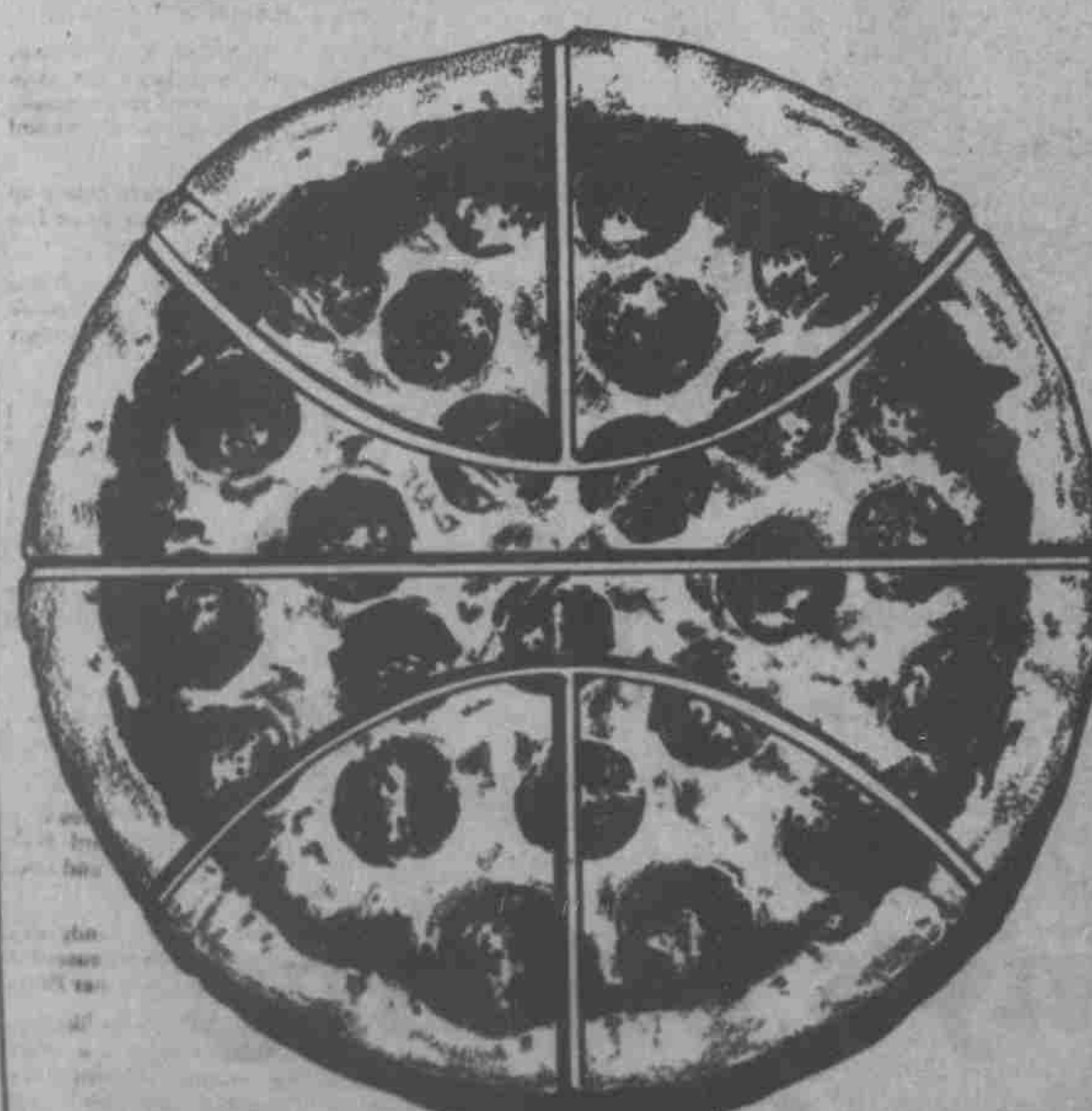
