

Blue Devils win third straight

With two minutes left to play, it appeared Duke had snatched a tie from the jaws of victory, failing to score on a fourth-and-goal.

But thanks to the Duke defense and a little luck, the Blue Devils edged Virginia Tech 14-7 Saturday when defensive back Dennis Tabron returned an interception 10 yards for a touchdown with 56 seconds left.

"I've been saying all along that Old Lady Fate would turn in our favor," Duke coach Red Wilson said.

Wilson also praised his defense and added that he believed his team had been taught a valuable lesson.

"I think we've learned to win," Wilson said.

The game's hero, Tabron, said the victory really meant a lot to the team, "because we were 21-point underdogs."

Quarterback Ben Bennett was instrumental in leading the Duke victory. He had not seen action since the season opener because of a shoulder injury, and reserve Ron Sally had come on to lead the Devils to two victories.

But Sally did not perform well Saturday, and Wilson only said, "He has been mighty good, but this just wasn't his day."

On the Blue Devils' winning play, Virginia Tech coach Bill Dooley took credit for calling the pass play.

"I take the blame for the pass call that gave them the winning touchdown," Dooley said. "I don't play to tie, I play to win."

"Defense ... you could not ask for anything better," Majors said, referring to the squad whose performance included seven tackles for a total of 29 lost yards.

"Our kicking game was also outstanding," Majors said. "I don't see how it could be much better. We not only punted well, but our coverage was good and our field goal kicker again gave us the winning margin."

Yellow Jacket Coach Bill Curry said the game was in the tradition of the old Georgia Tech-Tennessee games.

"The kicking game dominated play, and the final outcome was decided by who made the last mistake," Curry said.

Tennessee quarterback Steve Alatorre passed to wide receiver Anthony Hancock for a 42-yard touchdown play that gave the Volunteers the win.

Clemson head coach Danny Ford said the game looked like it was a lot of fun for his players.

"Right now I can't think of anything we did wrong, but I'm sure we'll see several things when we look at the film," Ford said.

He noted his defense got its first shut-out of the year and that the kicking and pass-coverage games were good.

Clemson tailback Cliff Austin led the offense, running for two touchdowns.

Florida 15 Maryland 10

Defensive back Kyle Knight dumped Maryland's quarterback in the end zone for a safety, and halfback James Jones lofted an option pass to his own quarterback Saturday as Florida defeated Maryland 15-10.

Florida went ahead 8-7 with 9:53 left in the third quarter when Knight tackled Norman Esiason 13 yards behind the line of scrimmage.

On Florida's next possession, quarterback Wayne Peace pitched the ball to Jones, then ran around the left into the end zone and grabbed Jones' pass from the 9-yard line, giving the Gators a 15-7 lead.

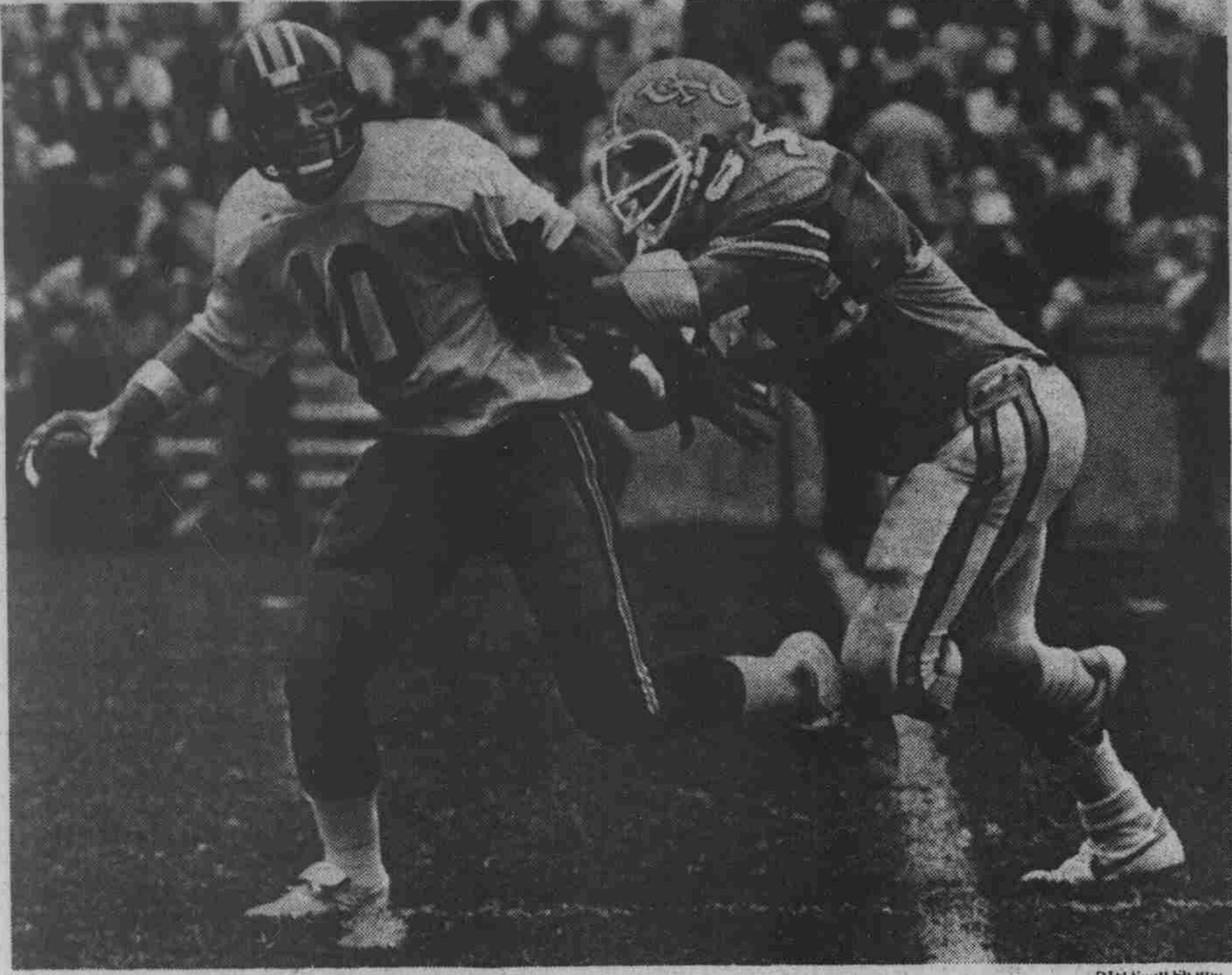
Maryland's Jesse Atkinson booted a 31-yard field goal with 10:18 left in the game for the Terrapins' final score.

The Florida defense sacked Esiason four times, costing the Terps a total of 38 yards.

Maryland opened scoring late in the first quarter when Esiason hit John Tice with a 4-yard scoring strike to take a 7-0 lead.

Florida answered in the second quarter with field goals of 31 and 49 yards by Brian Clark.

The victory boosted the Gator's record to 4-2, while the Terps, 35-20 losers to Florida last year in the Tangerine Bowl, dropped to 1-3-1.
