

Remarks create more conflict in Allen case

WASHINGTON — New discrepancies arose Wednesday in the story of how President Ronald Reagan's national security adviser came to receive \$1,000 in cash from a Japanese women's magazine that interviewed Mrs. Reagan.

But the president, after first saying he was in no position to comment while the matter was under review, told reporters the incident "was investigated, and it was reported that everything was fine."

It was not clear what Reagan meant, since a Justice Department investigation is still under way — as Reagan himself first indicated — and White House

spokesmen have said repeatedly there has been no internal probe of the matter involving national security adviser Richard V. Allen.

It was disclosed Wednesday by a Tokyo newspaper and confirmed by the White House that the magazine journalists who interviewed Mrs. Reagan one day after her husband's inauguration had given her a lacquered stationery box.

That gift was handled according to usual practice and is in storage at the National Archives, deputy White House press secretary Larry Speakes said. A private gallery that specializes in Asian art had estimated its value at \$75, he added. But Speakes could not explain why, if

the box was presented to Mrs. Reagan, there also would be an envelope containing \$1,000 in cash intended for her.

When the matter first surfaced last week, Speakes said the money was intended for Mrs. Reagan but had been intercepted by Allen, simply because he didn't want the first lady or the Japanese journalists to be embarrassed.

The money wasn't given to the White House Gifts Unit or the Treasury. It was put in a safe in the Executive Office Building and, Allen said, forgotten until it was found eight months later by someone else and turned over to the FBI.

Allen, in his last statement on the matter before announcing he would no

longer talk about it, said he did not arrange the meeting, but "did receive the initial request... which I passed to others for evaluation, handling and decision."

The request nonetheless did not go through normal channels. The first lady's press office, which usually handles all requests for interviews with Mrs. Reagan, did not arrange the magazine session. Sheila Patton Tate, Mrs. Reagan's press secretary, refused to answer most questions, saying she was under the same constraints as other White House officials who have been told not to discuss the case publicly.

But she said she was not present when the three representatives of the Japanese magazine met Mrs. Reagan in the White House, nor did she learn of the meeting until later.

Allen has acknowledged that he was present during the meeting and received the money then.

Kissinger barricaded in Brazil

BRASILIA, Brazil (AP) — Military police rescued former Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger from the University of Brasilia administration building Wednesday after about 400 chanting students barricaded him inside.

About 300 people were inside the administrative complex when students shouting anti-American slogans surrounded it in a two-hour siege following a lecture by Kissinger in the building's auditorium. Most of the listeners were diplomats, including several ambassadors.

Police broke through the demonstrators and escorted Kissinger to a waiting vehicle. Also escorted to safety were the second-ranking U.S. diplomat in Brazil, George High, and university Rector Jose Carlos Azevedo.

Government prepares to go broke

WASHINGTON (AP) — It might be just another false alarm, but the U.S. government began taking steps Wednesday to shut down as Congress and President Ronald Reagan found themselves at odds over meeting a midnight Friday spending deadline.

Technically, if Congress doesn't act by then to pass an emergency appropriations bill — one Reagan may veto anyway — the government will go broke. Does this mean the mail will stop being delivered, federal prisons emptied, the military sent home and Social Security checks halted?

Few in Congress or the executive branch of government seriously suggest this will happen, since such deadlines have come and gone in Washington many times before, and no federal employee have ever missed a paycheck.
