Students hold rally at NCMH to protest abortions

Marching in a cold rain, members of the Carolina Students for Life picketed against abortion in front of North Carolina Memorial Hospital Wednesday afternoon.

The seven protesters, carrying anti-abortion posters during their two hour picket, said they hoped to make people aware of the number of abortions that were performed at NCMH and possibly to prevent some women from having an abortion.

Chris Kremer, president of Carolina Students for Life, said the hospital performs

about 1,000 abortions every year.

"We chose Wednesday for the protest because that's the day the hospital does most of its abortions," said Kremer. "We want to expose people to what goes on at NCMH." Kremer said his group would follow up the protest by talking to hospital and university officials, doctors who perform the operation and the chairman of the Obstetrics and Gynecology Department at NCMH, Dr. Robert Cefalo. "We'd like to reach some sort of agreement with them to cut back on the number of abortions," Kremer said. "Ideally, we'd like them to stop second-trimester abortions. If not, we'll stage further pickets," he said.

Carol Lindsay, of Carrboro, one of the protestors, said, "We'd like to raise a few eyebrows or stop some women from having an abortion."

Kremer was also adamant in his opposition to performing the operation at NCMH. "We want to protest the killings that go on there," he said.

Kathy S. Bartlett, public affairs officer for the hospital, said Wednesday's protest was not

the first by Carolina Students for Life. "We respect their rights. We've talked with

them before, and we appreciate the care on their part they exercise in protesting," Bartlett said.

Kremer said some people who were given anti-abortion leaflets had responded with "some negative comment."

One person given a leaflet, however, said, "I don't believe it's right either."

Also, accompanying the story "Edwards, Miller seek to lead class," senior class president and vice president candidates Mark Edwards and Chris Miller were misidentified in a photograph. Miller was on the left and Edwards was on the right.

The DTH regrets these two errors.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak declared his support Wednesday for Palestinian self-determination and urged President Ronald Reagan "to make it a living reality."

In his debut here as Anwar Sadat's successor, Mubarak studiously avoided a direct reference to the 1978 Camp David agreements which Israel insists are the only basis for settling the Palestinian dispute.

WARSAW, Poland (AP) - About 760 officials - six of them provincial governors - have been fired since the Dec. 13 martial law crackdown, the official Polish news agency PAP said Wednesday.

At the same time, the government newspaper Republic blamed student activists for last Saturday's riots in Gdansk and said they wanted "a change in the political system in Poland."
