## Jobless funding added to budge

WASHINGTON (AP) - Republicans and Democrats swapped charges on the House floor Tuesday about who was to blame for the recession. But of ficials said almost everyone would vote for $\$ 2.3$ billion in additional benefits and services for the unemployed.
President Ronald Reagan has asked for the money to prevent states from running out of money for unemployment benefits and to restore budget cuts he won last year in funds for employment service workers. Leaders of both parties said they expected that the House would give final spending on low-income energy assistance by $\$ 123$ million.
