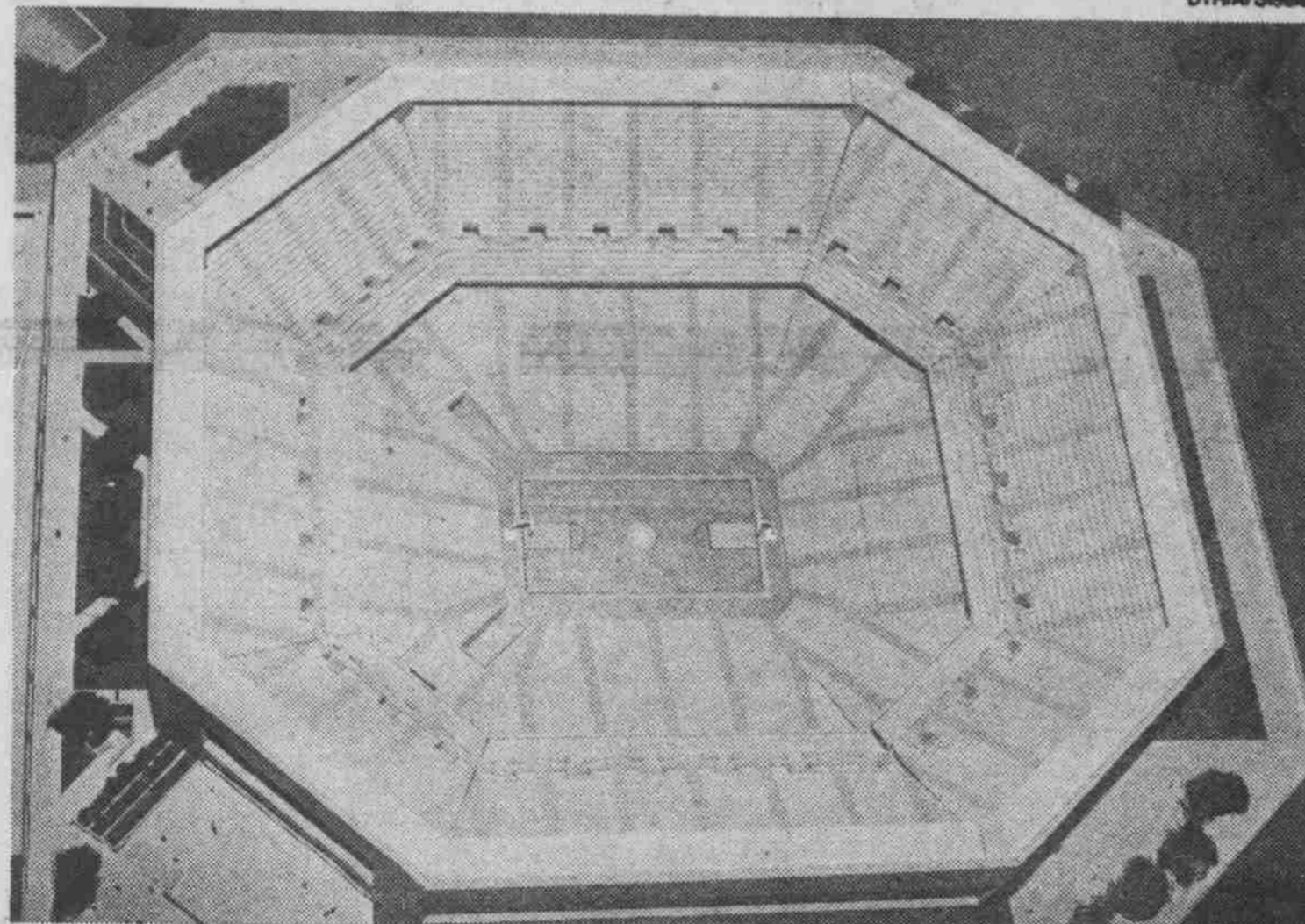

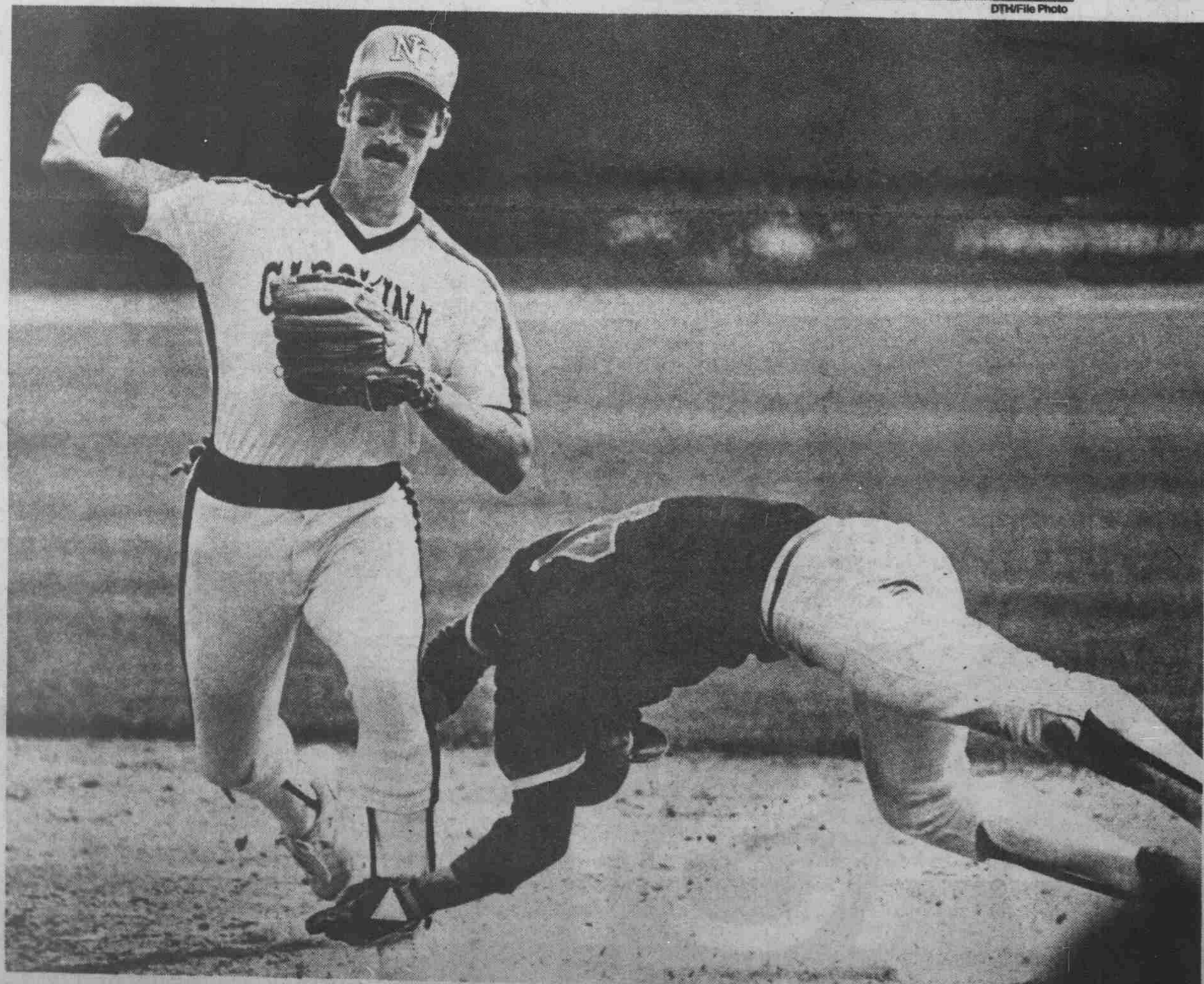
But champion of peace, Anwar Sadat, Egyptian president, was assassinated before he saw his goal fulfilled.



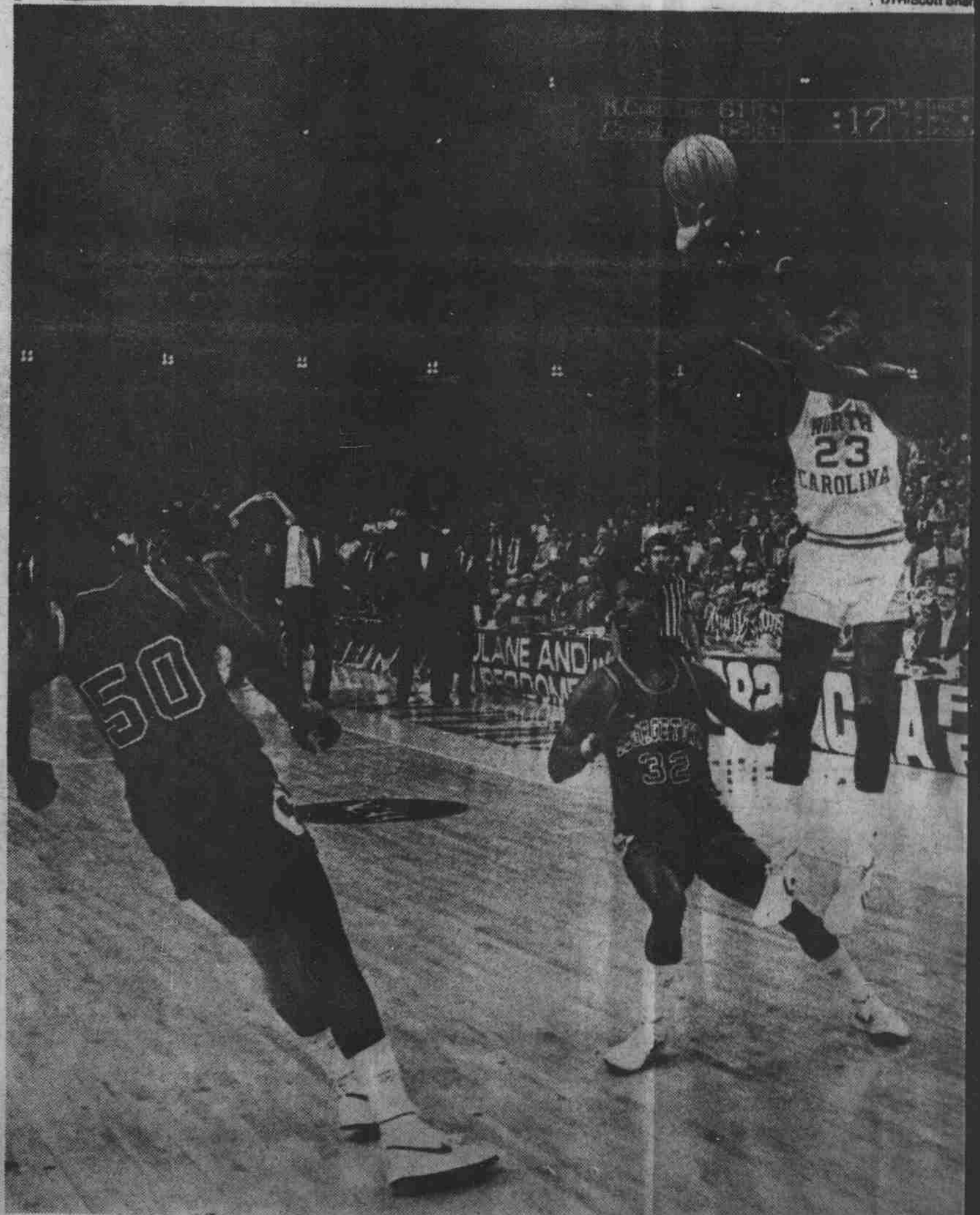
