## Baseball begins anew with summer league

With the Tar Heels' College World Series hopes drowned by the two quick losses in the South Atlantic Regional last week in Columbia, S.C., the thinking and planning around Boshamer Stadium has inevitably turned towards the future.

The North Carolina baseball dropped a 9-4 decision to The Citadel and a 1-0 squeaker to East Carolina, eliminating the squad from any further tournament play.

Next year suddenly doesn't seem so far away. The first step towards the reevaluation of goals and achievements starts on June 4, when the Tar Heels travel to UNC-Wilmington to open their 1982 summer season with a doubleheader.

It's call the North State College Baseball League, and with only three other teams in the conference—NC State, Campbell, and East Carolina.

There isn't the pressure here that engulfs the regular spring season, nor is there the jockeying for a position in the lineup that pervades the lengthy fall schedule.

This is the time for the veterans to polish unsatisfactory aspects of their game, the walk-ons to shine and somehow gain a spot on next year's team, the entire squad's chance to work together as a unit and play some relaxing baseball while staying in tune.

Carolina finished dead last in 1981, winning just seven games. But this summer's collection includes more than a few hold-overs from the ACC champion Tar Heels: second baseman Mitch McCleney, third baseman Jeff Hubbard, Chris Pittaro, outfielder Todd Wilkinson, spot stars Joe Rocklein and Stuart Jump, and catcher Tim McGee, who shared plate duties this past season.

The pitching staff includes bullpen aces Ronnie Huffman and Chris Mench, and Greg Karpuk, who holds the 1982 North Carolina strikeout record with 13 in one game.

A couple of players who redshirted this past season—Luke Rasnake and Jon O'Leary—will be back and there are a slew of junior varsity players hungry for playing time.

So there's baseball for those of you who can't survive the summer without it, for those who enjoy the combination of beer, baseball and the sun.

The Tar Heels open their home summer season June 11 against East Carolina.
