Israelis cancel PLO land evacuation plan

BEIRUT, Lebanon - The Israeli military command in Tel Aviv announced late Tuesday that the first planned overland evacuation of Palestine Liberation Organization guerrillas from Beirut to Syria "will not take place."

The Israeli communique said: "The overland evacuation scheduled for Wednesday morning will not take place. Only the evacuation from sea will go on from 12 noon - 6 a.m. EDT."

A command spokesman when asked who had canceled the scheduled busconvoy evacuation of some 2,000 guerrillas replied, "Not the Israelis. As far as I understand, it is the Syrians."

One possible reason for the postponement was a sudden outbreak of heavy shelling along the Beirut-Damascus highway on Tuesday. The Israeli com-

mand said battles erupted between rightwing Christian militias and Syrians north and east of Beirut. Christian radio broadcasts offered a different version, saying Syrian and Israeli gunners were shelling each other along a stretch of highway about 12 miles east of Beirut.

The evacuation plan calls for the bulk of the PLO forces in Beirut to leave via buses for Damascus, Syria. It says the "initial group" is to leave Wednesday with the rest following over the next 10 days. Israeli Army Radio said Tuesday that first group was to have included about 2,000 guerrillas and PLO officials, leaving in 40 buses.

U.S. Marines were poised to come ashore Wednesday to help police the overland evacuation. It was not immediately known whether they would proceed with those plans.

The evacuation by sea continued Tuesday, with another boatload of cheering

A Cypriot passenger ship sailed from the shattered Lebanese capital under U.S. 6th Fleet Naval escort. It carried the fourth contingent of PLO fighters since Saturday to homes in the Arab world following the 10-week Israeli siege to evict them from Lebanon.

Five 6th Fleet amphibious vessels cruised offshore with 800 Marines, ready to unload at dawn Wednesday to join French paratroopers and Italian infantrymen in a peacekeeping force to oversee the overland evacuation to Syria.

WASHINGTON - A federal judge Tuesday signed an antitrust settlement requiring the breakup of American Telephone & Telegraph Co., closing out an historic eightvear lawsuit.

U.S. District Judge Harold H. Greene signed the agreement between the Justice Department and AT&T around 5 p.m., giving it the force of law

By signing the antitrust settlement, Greene was closing out an antitrust suit filed by the Justice Department in 1974 and setting off the largest corporate reorganization in history.
