## Israelis cancel PLO land evacuation plan

BEIRUT, Lebanon — The Israeli military command in Tel Aviv announced late Tuesday that the first planned overland evacuation of Palestine Liberation Organization guerrillas from Beirut to Syria "will not take place."

The Israeli command said: "The overland evacuation scheduled for Wednesday morning will not take place. Only the evacuation from sea will go on from 12 noon - 6 a.m. EDT."

A command spokesman when asked why he had canceled the scheduled bus-convoy evacuation of some 2,000 guerrillas replied, "Not the Israelis. As far as I understand, it is the Syrians."

One possible reason for the postponement was a sudden outbreak of heavy shelling along the Beirut-Damascus highway on Tuesday. The Israeli com-

mand said battles erupted between right-wing Christian militias and Syrians north and east of Beirut. Christian radio broadcasts offered a different version, saying Syrian and Israeli gunners were shelling each other along a stretch of highway about 12 miles east of Beirut.

The evacuation plan calls for the bulk of the PLO forces in Beirut to leave via buses for Damascus, Syria. It says the "initial group" is to leave Wednesday with the rest following over the next 10 days. Israeli Army Radio said Tuesday that first group was to have included about 2,000 guerrillas and PLO officials, leaving in 40 buses.

U.S. Marines were poised to come ashore Wednesday to help police the overland evacuation. It was not immediately known whether they would proceed with those plans.

The evacuation by sea continued Tuesday, with another boatload of cheering

PLO fighters leaving Beirut after a thunderous send-off of the guerrillas firing their weapons into the air.

A Cypriot passenger ship sailed from the shattered Lebanese capital under U.S. 6th Fleet Naval escort. It carried the fourth contingent of PLO fighters since Saturday to homes in the Arab world following the 10-week Israeli siege to evict them from Lebanon.

Five 6th Fleet amphibious vessels cruised offshore with 800 Marines, ready to unload at dawn Wednesday to join French paratroopers and Italian infantrymen in a peacekeeping force to oversee the overland evacuation to Syria.

In New York, U.N. Secretary-General

Javier Perez de Cuellar released a message from President Reagan which said the Marines would not engage in combat. Reagan said earlier the force would withdraw "immediately" if shot at.

Pentagon spokesman Henry Catto said in Washington that the new fighting will not affect the Marine landing. He said the Marines would go ashore within 48 hours, but "the decision hasn't been made yet on just exactly when."

U.S. presidential envoy Philip C. Habib, who engineered the elaborate PLO pullout plan, met with Lebanese intermediaries to discuss final preparations for the overland evacuation to start Wednesday, Lebanon state radio reported.

**WASHINGTON** — A federal judge Tuesday signed an antitrust settlement requiring the breakup of American Telephone & Telegraph Co., closing out an historic eight-year lawsuit.

U.S. District Judge Harold H. Greene signed the agreement between the Justice Department and AT&T around 5 p.m., giving it the force of law.

By signing the antitrust settlement, Greene was closing out an antitrust suit filed by the Justice Department in 1974 and setting off the largest corporate reorganization in history.

**HILLSBOROUGH** — The Orange County Commissioners

deferred a decision Monday night on the proposed Midway Airport, until minutes from a public hearing can be reviewed. The minutes are expected to be available for the commission's Sept. 7 meeting.

If approved, the airport, which would be located in Bingham Township, would allow for the closing of Chapel Hill's Horace Williams Airport. The existing airport has been subject to criticism after two airplane crashes during the past year. Area residents are concerned that a plane might go down into one of the schools surrounding the airport.

Earlier this month, the county Planning Commission recommended that the commissioners reject the Midway proposal, citing a lack of compliance with Federal Aviation Administration standards.

## Federal ruling supports UNC desegregation plan

A federal appeals court in Washington, D.C. ruled 2 to 1 Tuesday it would not interfere with the plan reached last year on desegregation of the 16-campus University of North Carolina system.

"This is the third federal court that has sustained our position," UNC President William C. Friday said in a telephone interview Tuesday.

Friday said he hoped the ruling would close the door on the 12-year-old dispute, although he said there is one more legal step which the NAACP Legal Defense Fund, which appealed the decision, could take.

"It's been a long, long struggle," he said.

Raymond Dawson, vice president for academic affairs, said that when UNC lawyers called the General Administration office Tuesday afternoon to announce the decision, "we were glad to hear it, but we expected it." He said the Legal Defense Fund had challenged the validity of a decision which approved the decree by U.S. District Judge Franklin Dupree last July.

The court panel did not address the merits of the plan, but said the desegregation program was under the jurisdiction of a federal judge in North Carolina.
